- Improving women's access to training opportunities through scholarships.
- Enhancing the quality of training being offered to women, including women with disabilities.
- Providing new equipment and technology and training women how to use it.

Women in the West Bank face low employment rates due to the lingering economic impacts of Covid-19, the ongoing political situation, and gender and cultural barriers.

Although there are Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) programs available in the region, they are often inaccessible to women due to the many barriers they face, including financial barriers such as tuition and transportation fees.



Your compassionate support will improve the lives of women, including those with disabilities, in the West Bank by facilitating their participation in the Gender–Responsive and Inclusive Technical and Vocational Education and Training (GRIT) project.

Thanks to your generous gift, more women will have access to scholarship support, and the tools and equipment required to complete their training.

Furthermore, courses offered to new trainees have been improved to better match the needs of the job market and therefore yield better employment outcomes.

This has been achieved through the addition and enhancement of courses like sustainable agriculture, culinary arts, carpentry and woodworking, and mobile application and development. Work-place exposure, internships, and high-quality training have been put in place.

Other practical support such as transportation fees will continue to be provided to make it easier for women to participate in the project.
