every generation to realize that every believer is commissioned to "do the work of an evangelist."



I intentionally chose our speakers from diverse ministry streams to demonstrate our unity in Christ, to expose the younger generation to the powerful messages each speaker carries, and to show the value of receiving from each of their unique anointings. We basked in the reality of the Father's love, through the ministry of John Arnott, who led the great "Toronto Blessing" revival for many years, that impacted people all over the world. Benny Hinn's great ministry resulted in numerous testimonies of healing as we worshipped together. We also heard a powerful message from Terri Copeland-Pearsons about the necessity of being people of the Word to build our faith for what God wants to do in the coming days.

For me, one of the highlights of the Conference was Roberts Liardon's afternoon sessions as he shared the life stories of "God's Generals." We learned so much from the stories of these men and women of God who have gone before us to prepare the way for revival today. Their great experiences, and even their mistakes, taught us that we must be fully committed to give our lives, spiritually aware of the enemy's tactics, and filled with the power and anointing of the Holy Spirit in order to impact our world for Christ. In the morning sessions I sat with each speaker for Q&A time, and each of them shared intimately about their lives and the lessons learned from both their personal life experiences and their years of effective ministry.

On the final evening of the Timothy Conference, Jacob Walda and I ministered, demonstrating the power of merging generational anointings, and then laid our hands on every person to commission them into the harvest, ignited with fresh fire!

Whether you were part of the Timothy Conference or not, I want to encourage you, just as the Apostle Paul exhorted young Timothy, to "do the work of the evangelist". We are living in a time when all the forces of hell have been unleashed, particularly on the younger generation. Their minds are being bombarded with an anti-God, anti-Bible message that tries to convince them that evil is good and wrong is right. Many live without hope or purpose, and they need you and me to show them that our God is the same today as He has always been, and His love can transform them and fill their lives with peace.

It is this message that I have been declaring for over fifty years, and that Jacob continues to declare. It is the same message that our Champions of Hope teams are taking to communities throughout Nunavut, and then continue to mentor specific ones that they identify as potential leaders, so that they can in turn minister to their own people.
