Ministry Update

Our Champions of Hope discipleship program has been actively growing over the past few months as we've been hosting weekly online training sessions with our team leaders. They're doing incredibly well

and have been catching the heart of what it means to not only create a safe place for Inuit youth to process their faith, but also what it looks like to become a role model through their own mentoring and discipleship. The approach we've taken has a strong emphasis on building relationships and giving them the opportunity to ask difficult questions. We want them to not only expand their understanding of what it means to live a life of faith, but also see how it all comes together in a practical way day to day. Once our team leaders' training is complete, they'll each be launching their own weekly small groups, where they'll be mentoring and discipling youth from their own communities. Each meeting will also be followed with a debriefing session with Steven, to ensure they are able to process their small groups progress, as well as get additional support for any challenges they may be facing. Your support of this ministry is actively creating a platform that empowers Inuit to mentor and disciple the next generation of Inuit youth leaders that will be critical in the years to come!

We've also been building a new studio in our home which has included investing in new equipment, as well as backdrops that will give us a more effective platform to engage with a new audience online whether through YouTube, Instagram or Facebook. In the process, we've also been connecting with a number of key Christian leaders from across the country to begin strategizing and seeking the Lord together for new ways to reach the harvest in Canada. One of those initiatives has included Steven being named as the Nunavut Regional Director for the Canadian Prayer Firewall.
