86,476 DAYS OF SAFETY, RESCUE, AND CARE

In 2022, you provided 86,476 days of safety, rescue, and care to women and children! Not only are they able to escape the despair of the sex trade through vocational training and rehabilitation, but you also provided safety, food, and education for their children when they come to live at our safe houses.



ALOK'S REMARKABLE TURNAROUND

The first moment Alok arrived at our safe house, we could sense the deep wounds he carried inside. His dark eyes betrayed a pain that is hard to fathom.

His father died in a car accident when he was just a child and his mother, rejected by family, was eventually lured to the sex trade. She raised him as a single mother but failed to protect him from the exploitation of those around them. Alok was angry, deeply scarred, and hopeless. But thanks to generous support from donors like you, Alok got a fresh start in one of our safe houses. He finally found the care, comfort, and security he deserves.

Today, we're immensely proud to share that his mother has left the sex trade and started a reputable job with the government. And Alok? He's changed. He's hopeful and optimistic. Both him and his mother are thriving outside of the red-light district.

QUENCHING RAVI'S THIRST FOR EDUCATION

Ravi's mother wants nothing but the best for her son. Being the only two in their family, they have to rely on each other for everything, including fetching water from a distant well. It often made Ravi late or miss school altogether.

But now, thanks to a new well in their village, they don't have to trek long distances anymore. And Ravi's mother couldn't be happier. Finally, her son can go to school and get the education he deserves.

SURVIVAL AND SUCCESS IN MUMBAI

Bano's early childhood was a happy one, spent among her own people and the culture she knew so well. However, as often happens, poverty forced her family to uproot and seek opportunities elsewhere. They settled in Mumbai, India, where on day Bano found herself lost in the dangerous red-light districts of the city, and fell prey to the wrong people. the opportunity to learn and grow, developing a newfound passion for education and for making jewelry to support herself. Today, Bano is continuing her learning journey by attending college and forging a brighter, happier future for herself and her family.

After experiencing unspeakable tragedy, Bano found the strength to seek out help and was referred to our rehabilitation program. There, she embraced

241 women went through our sewing training and received a sewing machine to start their own tailoring business. These women, who are often poor mothers and widows, now have an opportunity to use their skills to rise out of poverty and work toward a promising future for themselves and their families.

Once trapped in poverty, Laila's future seemed bleak. Lacking any formal education, she fought to survive as a rag picker.

But you provided her with the opportunity to attend tailoring training which opened doors to a better life.

With unwavering determination, Laila not only mastered the art of tailoring but also honed her business skills to promote her craft. Now, she earns a fair wage and is able to provide for her children. For them, education is no longer out of reach, but a right they can embrace.

Meet Saina, a bright young girl who is about to enter 7th grade. She lives with her parents, two brothers and two sisters in a shanty house in the slums. They work hard as ragpickers to provide for their family but still having food, clothing, and shelter is a daily struggle.

Education was a luxury they couldn't afford. Then she was given the opportunity to attend one of our slum schools. Saina is now making excellent grades and has hopes that focusing on her studies will give her a better life. Thanks to your support, we can continue to provide education to children like Saina!

This may mean computer training, tailoring education, or providing the equipment necessary to to start small businesses.
