What is a Hero? A hero is someone with integrity and selflessness who puts the needs of others before themselves. At Hospice of San Joaquin, heroes come in many forms. The obvious ones are our nurses and home health aides. They work tirelessly to ensure our patients are granted their last desire – to be home with family and friends in their final days.

During this pandemic, when a physical visit is not always possible, staff are doing patient visits via telehealth. Most of our nurses would prefer not to conduct this type of visit, as they want

to see, hear, touch, and feel a personal connection. Our social workers and chaplains are just as busy speaking with patients and caregivers by phone, providing much needed emotional and spiritual support where it has always been critical in end-of-life care. Our office staff is helping wherever help is needed, no questions asked. They happily do whatever needs to be done to keep the agency going. Our grief support team is also providing telehealth support and is developing an online support group for local health care providers during these difficult and stressful times. Still other staff that are not as busy due to the pandemic, are helping other non-profits in the community that are short-staffed. As an example, we have staff that have volunteered to take temperatures at the homeless shelter, to help them screen for COVID 19 symptoms. Our volunteers are doing anything and everything they can to support Hospice of San Joaquin, from sewing masks and gowns for patient care, to making training manuals, and admission packets. As always, we ask and they deliver. That is what makes a hero, anyone that asks what needs to be done and then does it. Not for the benefit of themselves but for the benefit of others. The Hospice of San Joaquin team is a family full of heroes.
