Hospice House

The Hospice House provides specialty hospice care to patients that are experiencing uncontrolled symptoms, such as, uncontrolled pain, respiratory distress, nausea, agitation, or seizures (this is not an inclusive list). The Hospice House is staffed by RN's 24 hours a day with medical supervision provided by our Hospice Medical Director. All admissions require a nurse evaluation.

Transitions Care

What is Transitions?

The Transitions program provides patients and their caregivers with emotional support and education about living with a chronic or life limiting disease.

What services are provided?

Emotional support and education regarding community resources, advanced care planning, and disease processes. After the admission visit in the home, all other services are provided by phone.

Who is eligible for Transition services?

Anyone who is 18 years or older who has a life-limiting illness and lives in San Joaquin County. This service is provided free of charge to eligible participants.

Pacific Palliative Care

What is Pacific Palliative Care?

Pacific Palliative Care provides intense symptom management care provided in conjunction with patient’s curative treatment. Patients do not need to be terminally ill; in fact many will not be terminal for many years to come.

What services are provided?

In home nursing, social worker, chaplain, and aide visits based on patient need. Specialty nursing care services for symptom management support are available 24 hours a day.

Who is eligible for Pacific Palliative Care services?

Anyone covered by Blue Shield or Health Plan of San Joaquin that is suffering from pain and/or symptoms (i.e. pain, nausea, shortness of breath) due to ANY serious illness (i.e. lung, cardiac, liver disease, or cancer).

Hospice Care

What is Hospice Care?

Hospice care encompasses the physical, emotional, spiritual, and psych-social issues that occur at the end of life. Care is provided by an interdisciplinary team of professionals (i.e. MD, nurse, social worker, chaplain, hospice aide, and many others).

What services are provided?

In home care by nurses, social worker, chaplain, aide, and MD, based on patient and caregiver needs. All services are available on-call 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Medications and medical equipment related to the patient’s hospice diagnosis are included in hospice services.

Who is eligible for Hospice Care?

Any patient whose physician believes has 6 months or less to live, if their disease process runs its normal course and patient is no longer seeking curative treatment for their disease.
