They will continue to consult Legal, Liability Insurance and Medical professionals to make these decisions. We will continue to inform you with signage at the door, Facebook and our website. If any classes must be postponed or cancelled, we will update you via Facebook and our website. Crossroads believes Art will be a healing source of good for all in the come days! Come join us!

## New Normal

### WHAT WILL 2021 BRING?

It is difficult to plan for the unknown. Crossroads continues to follow all the OHA and CDC Guidelines. Bringing your child to the art center for classes (or coming for class yourself) will require a few extra steps.

For all Children's Classes we are required to do a brief wellness and log in who dropped off and who is picking up. If you choose to have your child walk home please make sure that box is checked on the Participation Registration Form (available in English and Spanish on our website.)

At this time: All persons age 5 and older are required to wear a face covering over their nose and mouth.

We ask that all parents continue the discussions you have had with your children over the course of the school year to include: Hand washing/hand hygiene, not hugging or touching other students, not touching their face, suck on the fingers or hair. It is a challenge! But we will manage it with kindness and patience. Remember don't send your child to class if they are not feeling well.

Because children are not yet vaccinated, social distancing is very important. Teachers will be vigilant in monitor this. If they are sucking on their fingers or touching their face they will be sent to the bathroom to wash their hands again.

Adult Classes are aligned to the State Risk Level Metric at this time. Please do not come to class if you feel unwell. We usually have a thermometer nearby if you want to take your own temperature. We are asking adults to model "best behaviors" to our young people including social distancing, mask wearing and hand cleanliness. We request that adults respect the signs posted at the door regarding mask wearing and appreciate your help in keeping Crossroads a safe place for all to enjoy.

As we write this, we fully expect the rules to change probably a dozen times! Staff will continue to use our website, social media, press release, signage, and even E-Blasts to update you on changes. We again ask for patience, kindness and courtesy as we navigate this difficult time.

# Membership Updates






