Paul is a shining beacon of positivity every moment that he is present in Crossroads. Through his work in Young Artists Studio and afterschool ArtSpeak classes, Paul provides a supportive and encouraging environment for budding artists where he has the opportunity to see first-hand the creativity, enthusiasm, and lack of artistic biases in his students. 


