We ask that students consider paying 10% of the class costs to assure that our scholarship fund can help as many families as possible. However, we are happy to provide full scholarships if needed. Ages: 10 and up (students younger than 10 are welcome to come and see if this class will work for them).

Class Description: Young people come to an open studio setting to learn and refine artistic skills with artist instructor Paul Hoelscher. The idea behind this ongoing class is to help young people make art the way that most interests them, with an artist who believes that everyone is artistic and who has enough personal experience to be supportive of many media and techniques. Media include acrylic, oil, and watercolor paint, soft and oil pastels, charcoal, graphite, conté, colored pencil and clay sculpture. Come and create - the sky's the limit!

Portrait Painting with Acrylic - 7-week Course

Instructor: Brian Vegter Dates: Tuesdays Evenings December 28 - February 8 *Time:* 5:30-7:30pm Location: Downstairs Studio Supplies: Provided by Crossroads Age: 15 years and Up Skill Level: Beginner to Experienced Course description: Brian Vegter will be bringing his years of experience painting in acrylic to Crossroads for this 7-week portrait painting course. Multiple styles of application and portraits will be executed during the 7-weeks. The focus will be on painting and the use of acrylic paints, and projectors can and will be used to get subjects onto the canvas. Additionally, freehand techniques will also be discussed and taught for students to learn ways of getting accurate proportions when a projector isn't readily at hand. Supplies are included for the first three paintings students will create during the 7-week period of the class. If students are fast painters they will need to purchase additional canvasses. Composition and color palette choice will be part of the instruction through the class. Cost: \$175 members / \$262.50 non-members Class minimum: 3

Barn Quilt Painting Workshop

Instructor: Cathy Treadway Dates: Saturday, January 15 Time: 9:30am-3:00pm (bring a sack lunch)

Age: 12 years and up

Course description: The popularity of barn quilting has grown as a means for community togetherness and spurs agri-tourism around the United States and Canada. More than 7,000 barn guilts are mapped on quilt trails through both private and public property. A barn quilt can be anything you want it to be simple or ornate - but its elements of color, contrast and symmetry are always prevalent, and visually tie it back to the art of heirloom guilting. In this all-day workshop you will make a 2 ' x 2' or 1' x 1' quilt block that will be painted on a square board that is for exterior display and uses exterior paints. All supplies for this class are provided by the instructor. We have a good assortment of quilt block patterns to choose from. If you have a specific quilt design you would like to use, you may bring it with you or contact the instructor ahead of time to see if it is a good fit for this class. Cost for 2x2 square: \$100 members / \$150 non-members Cost for 1x1 squares: \$93 members / \$139.50 non-members Class minimum: 2 Class maximum: 12
