Crossroads is undertaking our 5-Year Strategic Planning process in 2023. We are contracting with PARC Resources to lead our community through this process. It allows for a great "look back" on our organizational past as we find the exciting, new ideas for our future. At the same time, we will be working to create a Succession Plan and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Policy and Statement. As part of this we will be hosting these strategic planning outreach events in venues where we can meet families and senior citizens in person. Exciting days ahead!

Crossroads Sweet 60th Anniversary



In 2023 Crossroads will be celebrating our 60th Anniversary serving Baker County as the oldest continuously operating art center East of the Cascades. We are currently waiting on the outcome of grants to help guide our scope of projects. Some of the plans: Membership - Thanks to DE and Jane Clark Foundation our Student Membership (18 and under) in 2023 will be \$3-the same price it was in

1963! We are inviting everyone in 2023 to round up their membership with/or to \$60! Upgrade your SR. or Individual Membership to a \$60. Or round your membership up by 60 cents or \$6.30.

Crossroads plans two additional kids craft days and Make it and Take It in 2023. Plus, we hope to do a monthly booth at Farmers Market for Kids.

Crossroads is also using our 60th Anniversary to make strategic investments in the business of Crossroads. As mentioned earlier redoing our Strategic, Succession and DEI plans are first on the list.

Crossroads board will also be doing an internal process with a CPA firm to review our books-similar to an audit. With this firm's help we will develop the internal policies and procedures around future audit processes. This is critical step in our growth.

Under the leadership of Board Member Kathleen Chaves, we will be collecting 60 Stories about the role of Crossroads in our community and share on Facebook as a "Humans of Crossroads" Facebook page.






