Our "Pay What You Can" payment model for classes is thriving as a significant improvement for assisting with the cost of our programs for rural families, seniors, and community members with limited ability to participate in Crossroads Education programs. While we offered student scholarships in the past, with our "Pay What You Can" model, we have temporarily suspended the need for such forms!

How it works:

Look at our Fall Class Schedule Online at www.crossroads-arts.org and find classes of interest for you or your student!

 Choose to pay full tuition, half tuition, or any other amount you can afford. If your family is struggling, it can even be zero. Complete your registration using your current Crossroads account or start a new Crossroads account.



- In the privacy of their own home, families can look at their budget and the value and knowledge that they or their child have gained in Crossroads classes, and make the best decision for them regarding what they can pay.
- Teachers will be paid as usual for the hard work and valuable services they provide!

This option will be available for both Children's and Adult class registrations. Crossroads has also added a "Pay What You Can" FAQ Sheet in our "forms" library on our website. We hope this FAQ Sheet answers all of your questions, but please feel free to contact Crossroads if you need any additional help.



The ArtSpeak Program has been robust during the last several months, and I can honestly say that we have exceeded some of our goals. Our backbone is our ongoing after-school program. We continue to have gifted artists working consistently throughout the school year. In the Fall, we plan to add yoga classes to our schedule of art and dance. We also began a partnership with BELC this past winter. In total, we hold seven classes a week for students ages 3-12 years old. We hope to work with Baker Middle School and High School students.

Working with children is not ArtSpeak's only goal. We are



very much an outreach program and there are many adults in our community who cannot get to Crossroads, so we go to them! This year we began a weekly Tai Chi class at Step Forward. We have two art classes scheduled each week with the residents of Meadowbrook and Settlers' Park. Our goal is to enrich, to encourage creative expression, and to help all persons access the arts.

Student/Teacher Expectations

At Crossroads, mutual expectations between students and instructors lay the groundwork for a thriving creative environment. Students are urged to arrive ten minutes prior to class. This early arrival enables them to locate their class, prepare their art supplies (if required), and mentally transition into the creative mindset for maximum engagement. Similarly, instructors should be present 15-20 minutes ahead of time, granting them ample opportunity to set up the workspace, review the class, and make any necessary alterations. This pre-class preparation ensures a smooth, uninterrupted flow of artistic instruction. These proactive habits imbue Crossroads with a sense of respect and responsibility, cultivating an environment conducive to creative exploration and growth.

INTRODUCTION TO BASIC CALLIGRAPHY

This is a great introduction to an "easy to learn" style of calligraphy known as uncials. It is one of the earliest styles of lettering. Students will be led through the alphabet and basic layout, and sent home with plenty of practice papers! Felt tip calligraphy pens recommended over traditional ink pens. Yin Yoga

The word "yoga" means "yoke" or "unites" in Sanskrit. Yin simply translates as feminine, negative, or dark. Yin is the opposite of Yang, "positive and light." Yin Yoga consists of 8-10 gentle poses that assist with deep stretching and release of fascia, which helps relieve joint pain. When yoga postures of the asanas are held from 5 to 7 minutes, it promotes healing within the body. Most of the postures are performed while seated or laying down. Please bring a mat, water bottle, and wear comfortable clothing.

NHOTIC PARTNERSHIP

In June, Crossroads and the Bureau of Land Management announced our partnership, with Crossroads becoming the new Friends Organization for the National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center (NHOTIC). Crossroads will be supporting the work of NHOTIC, and we will handle the management of the Gift Shop, manage the marketing, and support their arts, culture, heritage, and humanities programming, including the Flagstaff Gallery, the 100 seat Leo Adler Theatre, the outside amphitheater, and the Wagon Box Gallery. The Interpretive Center is scheduled to reopen on Memorial Day weekend of 2024 and Crossroads is already planning!



The gift shop will be a wonderful opportunity to sell artwork of local and regional artists and fill a gift shop with as many local/ regional products as possible. The goal is to host an artist/local business informational evening at Crossroads to share how we will manage the products, themes of NHOTIC, and share the process of how we will accept work later this year. Crossroads will also be offering a limited scope food and beverage at NHOTIC and will be looking for vendors and local shelf stable food items to sell. The gift shop area is being expanded, and the acknowledgement room will be converted into a casual café area.



Crossroads will partner with NHOTIC and the Flagstaff Gallery. Crossroads will likely host 1-2 three-month art shows at NHOTIC yearly. That selection process will be added to our Annual Call for Featured Artists, which should be published this summer. Crossroads will also support educational programming at NHOTIC. This is in the planning phase, but may include concerts, films, or other programming onsite and we hope that Crossroads classes can occasionally move up to NHOTIC. Think En Plein Aire at Flagstaff Hill or Craft days at NHOTIC. Crossroads will also support NHOTIC with an event like Oregon Trail Days, which was a huge success in its first year.



Crossroads will be hiring more staff to support the Gift Shop, which will need at least two employees. Crossroads will create a Friends of NHOTIC committee, which will bring volunteer community members to help staff with ideas, volunteerism, and organization. While Crossroads programming at the Carnegie Library will be unchanged, this does allow Crossroads the opportunity to grow our financial base once we are operational. To become operational, we will need investment, and we are working with foundations and looking for donors to help with startup costs of such a major intaking. SPECIAL CONCERT

Crossroads is thrilled to welcome JIM-ISAAC CHUA, a Filipino-American pianist from the Tri-Cities of Washington, for a special concert on Saturday, September 30th from 6:00pm to 7:30pm at Baker High School. He has been awarded in numerous international piano competitions in the USA, France, and Austria. Tickets will be available to purchase on the Crossroads website starting August 1st. In 2009, he gave his solo debuts at Carnegie Hall and the Kosciuszko Foundation in New York. In 2010, he performed his first concert tour organized on the occasion of Chopin's 200th anniversary by Polish Organizations on the West Coast of the United States.

Since 2014, he has been regularly invited to perform recitals and lectures in Southeast Asia. In the Philippines, particularly, he has been invited to almost every music school and university to give concerts, masterclasses, and workshops. His performances are heavily praised as "... an amazing feast for the ears ... he created such an amazing atmosphere an immense variety of climates" (Szczecin Radio) and "Ravishing! The pianist delighted the audience



with his brilliant technique, excellent articulation, ability to use timbre and dynamics, who gave him a standing ovation" (Sala Koncertowa PSM w Jastrzębie Zdrój).

In 2022, he gave a full-house concert for the Arc of Tri-Cities, raising around \$10,000 for people with special needs - "a model of artistic perfection in every respect . .. from Bach to Ravel, his treatment was precisely in context - but, of course, with his own individual flair. Such is the mark of a truly great musician." (Dave Clark).

Isaac's concert will raise support for our Youth Programs at Crossroads including ArtSpeak.

We thank Heather Jorgenson-Stone for facilitating Isaac's concert in Baker City. We thank the Stone Family, who are providing housing for Isaac's stay, and Baker High School Band and Choir programs for allowing access to the Auditorium. His story as a firstgeneration American immigrant whose parents have no music background, and the teachers that inspired his career, is powerful. He is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music in New York, Vancouver Academy of Music, and the Karol Szymanowski Academy of Music.
