THE FURNACE FUND

In late December, we began to have significant issues with the upstairs furnaces at Crossroads. We have written grants to cover the high costs of the four units in the attic. If those grants do not come to fruition the Board of Directors will have to completely deplete our Building Maintenance Fund.

The Carnegie Library Restoration and all the building improvements were completed in 2008. Believe it or not that is 14 years ago! So all this equipment is hitting the end of its useful lifespan. Crossroads has been replacing and repairing appliances and equipment as we go but the upstairs furnaces are very expensive. Good news is the downstairs furnaces have a few more years of life in them. Crossroads Board of Directors is starting a new "Furnace Fund" where donations can be given specifically for the upkeep of the Carnegie Library Building systems. The term kumihimo specifically refers to braiding with cords and is a centuries old Japanese art form that continues to inspire contemporary artists around the world. Its history goes way back to the Samurais, who used various types of braids to decorate their swords and horse armor. Grow What You Love Youth Series



GROW WHAT YOU LOVE - LOVE WHAT YOU GROW / YOUTH CLASS SERIES

Designed to help young students learn some plant basics while participating in the beautiful and artistic process of growing a garden, this is a perfect-for-spring series that combines creativity with a love of plants. Although it is most beneficial for students to take the entire series so that they may see progress, each class may also be taken individually. Either way, students will have something to take home at the end of every class. We will also keep some plants at Crossroads so there will be a reference for stages of growth and extra plants in case of unexpected losses. This is a free ArtSpeak class but you must preregister for each session. Please call if you have special circumstances. Students older than 12 may be needed as helpers. Students younger than 8 may be able to participate with a parent or older sibling.

Session 1 - DIRT Babies April 22nd

Dirt Babies are simply adorable with their wild green tresses and sparkly features. In our first class, each student will make their own special and unique friend. Your Dirt Baby will last as long as you give it a little love, light and attention. You might even be inspired to give your Dirt Baby another friend or maybe even a family - because the only thing cuter than one Dirt Baby is more of them! Making Dirt Babies is fun and creative, but our babies will also show us just how much a few small grass seeds can do.

Session 2 - Flowers and Painted Pots

April 29th

It is impossible not to love flowers. Their colors, smells and shapes remind us of the beauty around us. Flowers make us feel happy. They help us celebrate and they cheer us up when we are sick or sad. You can never have too many flowers! In our second class, we will plant a few different kinds of flowers. We will also paint some special flower pot houses for them to grow in. You can keep some flowers and watch them grow and still give some away to someone you love.



Session 3 - Vegetables and Decorated Plant Stakes

May 6th

When we are patient and attentive to our plants they can help us to grow strong and healthy. If we give them what they need, they will do the same for us! Growing vegetables takes some time so these plants teach us a lot about being responsible. When summer comes, you will be able to enjoy your own tasty, homegrown vegetables. You might even be able to share some with friends! In this third class, we will start a few different vegetables that can be transferred later to your own garden or to larger containers. We will also decorate plant stakes to remind us what we've planted.

Session 4 - Herbs Scents and Spice

May 13th

Herbs and spices add something extra to our food when we cook. They have strong scents because they are very strong plants, typically living through a cold winter and generously re-seeding themselves in the spring. Their smells are so strong that we can use them for perfumes and even for cleaning. In our fourth class, we will plant a few different types of herbs. We



will make some small pots so you can keep them in a sunny kitchen window. They will easily live outside as well, right in the ground or in containers. With some love they will come back again next year when you have almost forgotten about them.

Session 5 - Some to Take and Some to Share

May 20th

The dictionary says that "to share" means to use or enjoy with others. In our 5th class, we will do some planting and tending to the Crossroads courtyard garden boxes. Using some well established nursery plants and also some seeds, we will begin to bring those boxes back to life and share our gifts with the community. 
