Impact of COVID-19 in India

On May 18, government officials eased restrictions in India. The current living conditions in India are not reported in the US so we reached out to our India Program Coordinator, Usha Parthasarathy, to find out how things really are.

According to Usha, the situation is grim. She explained to us that the number of positive cases continue to rise. The curve has not begun to go down. Many people may be asymptomatic or not be tested at all. Little is known about what is happening in rural areas, but there are high numbers of cases in the cities where it is crowded and impossible to socially distance, like in the slums of Mumbai.

Daily laborers have been affected and have no money. The government is distributing free rations and vegetables so people have food, but without jobs, the overall economy is devastated.

Save One Life's distribution of sponsorship funds in June will come at a critical time to our beneficiaries in India and give them the boost they need to help them through this situation.

As of this writing we have 24 beneficiaries in need of a sponsor or<u>saveonelife.net</u>. Of those, 22 are from India. Please consider sponsoring a beneficiary today.
