Barry Haarde completed his most ambitious Wheels for the World tour on September 16 in Key West, Florida, 58 days after taking off from the Puget Sound in Washington State.

Barry traversed Washington, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, South Dakota, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Michigan. Then he hopped over to Maine to ride the Atlantic seaboard. In total Barry visited 21 states and Washington DC, meeting with members of our community all along the way. We thank everyone who cheered Barry on, and more than 80 generous individuals and organizations who donated to this year's ride.
