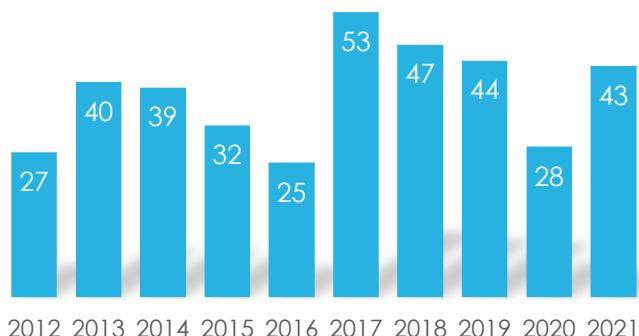
## Evolution of the Program

In 2012, Save One Life established a scholarship program for people with bleeding disorders in developing countries. This was in response to a clear need for higher education but limited access to scholarship funding in these countries.

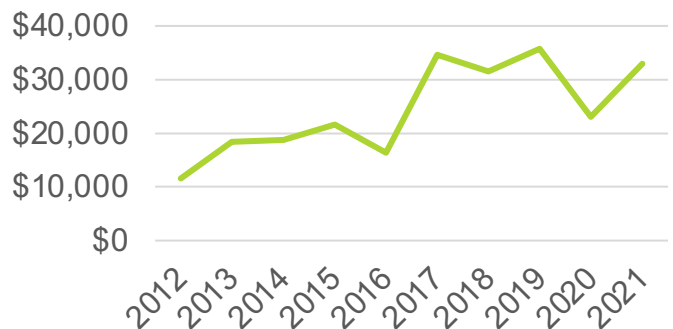
Since most people with bleeding disorders in developing countries have little to no access to appropriate treatment, they are often limited by physical disabilities as a result of untreated bleeds. Without a higher level of education, manual labor is often the only way to earn an income. Save One Life wanted to help people gain access to education and training so they may obtain employment and fiscal independence.

Since 2012, Save One Life has provided 378 scholarships to 214 students in 10 countries. The program was funded through general fundraisers until 2019, when Sanofi partnered with Save One Life. The consistent funding has helped the program to expand.

# 2021 Overview

In 2021 Save One Life awarded scholarships to 43 people in seven countries. The average scholarship amount was \$766.

Applications for scholarships boomed in the second half of 2021 as COVID-19 lockdowns lifted in many countries. We were happy to support so many amazing students.

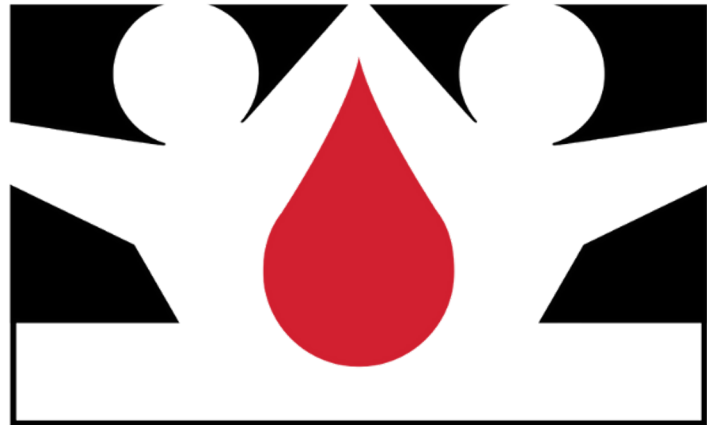
