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About Us

Save One Life is a nonprofit organization dedicated to improving the lives of children and young adults living with bleeding disorders in the developing world. A monthly sponsorship of just \$20 supplies a child with school fees, nutritious foods, transportation to clinic, and other basic needs. Save One Life offers resources and hope to individuals disabled and often socially stigmatized. In 2008 we supported 356 patients with bleeding disorders in Belize, the Dominican Republic, Egypt, India, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Romania and Zimbabwe. We added 117 beneficiaries to our program and included Zimbabwe to our list of country partners.

Save One Life is unique: 100% of sponsorship funds go directly overseas, not to overhead. Almost all funds go directly to the sponsored person.

- Began operating in Zimbabwe, sponsoring ten beneficiaries.
- Expanded programs in all partner countries.

- Published four issues of *OneVoice*, our quarterly newsletter.
- Welcomed three new board members.
- Updated 99% of beneficiary profiles.
- Promoted Save One Life to the Episcopal Church in North Carolina and Virginia.
- Interviewed on 104.9 FM, WBOQ, Boston.
- Received the "Breakthrough Spirit" Award by the Children's Cancer and Blood Foundation.
- Honored by the Texas Central Hemophilia Association annual fundraiser.
- Produced our first press release.
- Provided 16 digital cameras to country partners in India.
- Formed a Strategic Planning Committee.
- Added 117 beneficiaries.
- Launched a new website.
- Raised \$13,335 to sponsor eleven beneficiaries for five years at a fundraiser at the Marlborough Gallery, NYC.
- Received \$1,920 to sponsor two beneficiaries pre-paid for four years from the Red Nose Interact Club of Arizona.
- Received \$4,208 for three five-year sponsorships in Zimbabwe from a Chicago Marathon fundraiser.

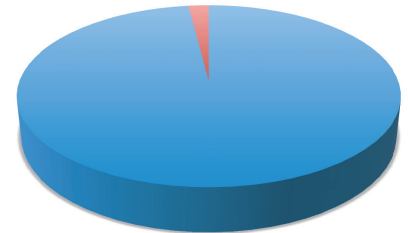
