


ANNUAL REPORT 2018

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Visiting the two-room home of an impoverished family with hemophilia in Karachi, Laurie asked how she could help. The family had two sons with hemophilia, the eldest of which would be expected to support the entire family when the parents grew old, as is customary. The father requested \$20 a month so that his eldest son, then only eight, could go to private school to learn English and one day earn a good income. The idea for Save One Life was born!

A year later, Save One Life was incorporated. The name occurred to Laurie when she watched the movie "Schindler's List," which cited the proverb "He who saves one life, saves the world," found in the Talmud and the Koran. It's the belief that we don't have to focus on huge numbers and statistics, which may overwhelm us.


Usha Parthasarathy coordinates our 28 program partners throughout India. She knows them personally and helps them directly impact the lives of many children and their families.



2018 HIGHLIGHTS

1. SEVEN SUMMITS ACHIEVED

Our new year kicked off with board member Chris Bombardier making history by becoming the first person with hemophilia to conquer the Seven Summits, the highest peak on each of the seven continents!

His dramatic summit of Everest in 2017 left only Mt. Vinson in Antarctica to summit, which he accomplished on January 6. On each summit Chris proudly carried the Save One Life banner to remind everyone of the needs of those with bleeding disorders in developing countries. Through Chris's efforts, starting with Mt. Kilimanjaro in 2011, more than \$100,000 was raised and 100 children sponsored.



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FIELD VISITS DON'T ALWAYS HAVE TO BE IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. JUST PRIOR TO ATTENDING THE WFH CONGRESS IN GLASGOW, SCOTLAND IN MAY 2018, LAURIE KELLEY MADE A SPECIAL VISIT TO A LONG-TIME SPONSOR WHO LIVES IN A REMOTE AREA.

Janet Howard, a single mother of six, lives in Shetland, Scotland. Shetland is a group of islands that lies 404 miles north of Glasgow, in the North Sea. It has a fascinating history and geological topography.

Jan has an adult son with hemophilia, and three daughters with bleeding disorders, including von Willebrand disease. To get treatment when they were small, Jan had to charter a plane to get to an HTC on the Scottish mainland. Luckily, Jan is a nurse and learned how to home infuse.

Despite being a single mother, with a large family Jan felt it important to give to those in need overseas. She and her children sponsor two boys from Nepal. Jan contacted Laurie years ago to request free books about hemophilia when her children were young. Since then she has become Laurie's friend, and since 2013 a sponsor. She also donates to our many fundraisers.

Jan inspires Save One Life, and it inspires her! For Barry Haarde's memorial ride in 2018, Jan simultaneously rode her bike around Shetland, even though she is not a cyclist! She has since taken up running and is now entering in races. One of her greatest dream is to hike in Nepal, and meet her two beneficiaries. Thank you, Jan, for your enduing spirit and generosity!


