2019 HIGHLIGHTS

1. CHRIS BOMBARDIER BECOMES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In January, Chris Bombardier, famous for being the first person with hemophilia to climb the Seven Summits, took the helm as executive director! Save One Life will forever be grateful to former Executive Director Martha Hopewell's stewardship of the organization.

Chris had been a Save One Life board member for seven years and had already raised over \$100,000 for Save One Life before he took the position as executive director.



2. PROJECT SHARE NOW A PROGRAM OF SAVE ONE LIFE

Project SHARE (Supplying Hemophilia Aid and Relief), a factor donation program established by Laurie Kelley and previously operated by LA Kelley Communications, became an official program of Save One Life.

Project SHARE donates unused or unwanted factor to patients and clinics in developing countries. It has saved lives and enabled people with bleeding disorders to attend school, have surgery and work again. Project SHARE's mission fits perfectly with the work of Save One Life. We are now able to bring even more care to our community in need overseas.



3. BOMBARDIER BLOOD HITS TIMES SQUARE AND MORE

In celebration of World Hemophilia Day, the New York City Hemophilia Chapter, Save One Life, Believe Limited and Octapharma held a special movie screening on April 14. *Bombardier Blood* is a documentary about Chris Bombardier, the first person with hemophilia to summit Mt. Everest and his journey to get there. After the screening, Chris was joined by Executive Producer Alex Borstein, Director Patrick James Lynch, Jessica Bombardier and other members of the Believe Ltd. team for a Q&A session for the 300 attendees. Alex, who has mild hemophilia A, is an Emmy Award winning actress on *The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel*, the voice of Lois Griffin on the animated comedy series *Family Guy*, and now *Bombardier Blood*'s executive producer! We give special thanks to Alex for her incredibly generous donation of \$100,000 in honor of the film.



The film was also shown in 22 locations around the US and helped to increase awareness of Save One Life. We are grateful to Octapharma for its sponsorship, and to everyone who helped screen Chris's incredible journey!

6. HELPING WOMEN AND GIRLS WITH BLEEDING DISORDERS GLOBALLY

Save One Life and the Hemophilia Foundation of Michigan partnered to help provide equal opportunity for women with bleeding disorders around the world.

HFM works with Days for Girls International to produce reusable feminine hygiene kits for women and girls. When Save One Life visits our program partners in developing countries, we will bring these kits with us and hold educational meetings.

Our inaugural program was attended by almost 50 women on August 3 at the Jose Memorial Hemophilia Society-Kenya.



7. WELCOME NEW PROGRAM PARTNERS

The Haemophilia Society of Tanzania (HST) and Coastal Haiti Mission became new program partners of Save One Life! After Chris's visit to Tanzania in August, the Save One Life board of directors voted unanimously to accept HST into our program.

In addition, Laurie Kelley has worked for over 16 years to start a program in Haiti. She finally succeeded and we were thrilled to welcome Coastal Haiti Mission as a program partner!

Save One Life can now enroll children these program partners identify into our sponsorship program and individuals can apply for scholarships and micro-enterprise grants.

WHEELS FOR THE WORLD AND THE TOUR DIVIDE

Save One Life held its second annual Wheels for the World Community Ride in Ipswich, Massachusetts on June 23. Over 60 riders came to ride in memory of Texan Barry Haarde and in honor of Chris Seistrup, a cyclist carrying on Barry's legacy.

Chris Siestrup made history as the first person with hemophilia to not only complete the Tour Divide but also win the race! This annual mountain biking race traverses the length of the Rocky Mountains, from Canada to the Mexican border.

We couldn't be more impressed with Chris's amazing accomplishment and his dedication to carry on Barry Haarde's legacy. His efforts, in addition to the community ride, helped Save One Life exceed our fundraising goal of \$25,000. Overall, Wheels for the World 2019 raised over \$32,000!

FIELD VISITS

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

In September, Save One Life program managers visited the Dominican Republic's Fundación Apoyo Al Hemofílico (FAHEM). They met with four beneficiaries in their homes, two micro-enterprise grant recipients at their businesses, and almost all of the 22 beneficiaries sponsored through FAHEM. The group meeting was a perfect way for everyone to discuss Save One Life's programs and the program managers were able to see the amazing work FAHEM is doing in person!



INDIA AND THE PHILIPPINES

Chris Bombardier traveled to India and the Philippines to conduct interviews with scholarship recipients of Save One Life. A production crew from Believe Limited filmed these powerful stories, to share through our social media channels and at community events.

Eighteen young men were interviewed along with family members and chapter leaders. Their stories of overcoming struggles to earn degrees are incredibly inspiring. Some of the men interviewed have secured jobs that provide financial stability and independence. Others are still in school and are hopeful that they will graduate and find jobs in the near future.

Chris also met with chapters leaders of the Mumbai, Thane, and Guwahati hemophilia societies in India, Hemophilia Advocates - Philippines (HAP) and Hemophilia Association of the Philippines for Love and Service (HAPLOS). Many beneficiaries of Save One Life's sponsorship program were in attendance and shared their thanks for our donors' commitment to improving their lives. *A special thank you to Andrea Trinidad and Usha Parthasarathy for coordinating these trips and their extraordinary volunteer efforts.*



KENYA AND UGANDA

Chris Bombardier, Laurie Kelley and other Kilimanjaro climbers were excited to meet with the Jose Memorial Hemophilia Society-Kenya. The team visited beneficiaries in their homes, met with physicians and attended a patient meeting. Founders Maureen Miruka and Kehio Chege explained the many challenges patients with bleeding disorders face in Kenya as well as the amazing progress they have made in recent years. This inspired the Kilimanjaro team to climb!

Chris traveled to Uganda to meet with the Haemophilia Foundation of Uganda. The organization's executive secretary, Agnes Kisakye, helped organize a physical therapy clinic with Save One Life volunteers Angela Forsyth and Alice Anderson. Seven physical therapists from different regions of Uganda learned about bleeding disorders and evaluated over 20 patients. These patients were given the opportunity to learn more about their bleeding disorders and how to better care for themselves at home.
