A MESSAGE FROM STEVE FOUNDER & PRESIDENT



Enlarge your tent; stretch it out and make it wider. Do not hold back. Make the ropes longer and its stakes stronger, because you will spread out to the right and to the left. (Is 54:2,3)

During this past year, Impact Nations saw unprecedented growth. How did this happen? I suspect two reasons: we kept saying 'yes' when the Lord called us to follow Him into new things and new places. Secondly, the number of men and women who committed themselves to praying grew significantly. In short, we recognize all that happened is simply the grace of God.

As you read over this annual report, you will see that more people went on more Journeys of Compassion to more places than ever before, including two new nations—Nepal and Tanzania. In fact, the Lord was doing so much in Nepal, we went twice! We introduced something new: Extreme Journeys. One team slept in tents at 8,700 feet; another hiked for eight hours to get to an unreached and very needy village. Working with our partners in northern India and East Samar in the Philippines, we broke new spiritual ground that so far has led to over 5,200 new house churches being planted by our partners as a direct result of the Journeys.

A highlight for us was the completion of the Hope & Care school which houses over 400 children in western Uganda. This was our biggest project to date. We partnered with the Ontario Gleaners to provide 140,000 meals for malnourished children in Haiti. Through installing and distributing household water filters, drilling wells and building spring boxes, 2016 saw us provide permanent safe water to over 20,000 people.

Be sure to take a few minutes to look over the lists on pages 12-15 to see what was accomplished; I think you will be both surprised and thankful for what the Lord has allowed Impact Nations to do.

Finally, on behalf of our team in Canada, the US and Australia, as well as our partners on the ground in the various developing nations—thank you to every one of you whose faithful and generous giving has made all of this possible. And thank you to the growing number of men and women who "stand in the gap", interceding for Impact Nations.

WHAT WE DO



JOURNEYS OF COMPASSION:

Journeys of Compassion put hands and feet to the adventure of the Gospel. Everywhere we go, Christ is preached, the sick are healed and good news to the poor is demonstrated in prisons, hospitals, mobile medical clinics and feeding programs. Journeys vary in length from one to two weeks, and reach across the world, from Africa to Asia to Central America.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS:

Long after the Journeys are over, the community transformation continues. Clean water projects, sanitation training, farm cultivation, and education for children and training for women at risk are just a few examples of the projects that bring health, wholeness, and hope to the communities where we work.

Development Projects

The ultimate goal of all of our projects is community transformation and sustainability. We meet both the immediate needs of people for survival while simultaneously addressing the underlying causes of poverty.

OUR PROGRAMS




IThirst Water Program

Child Sponsorship


Sponsorship provides school tuition, school uniforms, school supplies, and a daily meal for children in our sponsored schools.

The JOC consisted of medical clinics, water filter distribution, healings and people giving their lives to Christ. The team went into Kantegalamire. We were the first white people to come in 15 years. The medical clinic was the first ever in this community. In this village, 1,000 children had the protection of anti-malarial mosquito nets, about 200 people received medical care, and 300 people had a permanent source of safe drinking water.

Our team headed into the remote villages of the Himalayan foothills, which some were completely Buddhist. Hundreds received medical care; hundreds more received a permanent source of clean drinking water. People accepted prayer and we saw significant healing and people accepting Christ. The team worked with a church, which after 20 years had about 20 people attending. When we left, that number was about 65, a significant change.

We ministered in 8 barangays. In each community Jesus miraculously healed many. It was reported that 200 house churches are now active after our previous trip. The team went out praying for people, giving rice, and distributing water filters. Over 1000 people gained access to clean water. Thirty people were baptized as the community clapped and cheered, many of them seeing their first ever baptism.

Over 100 houses were wrapped in plastic to prevent leaking during the monsoon season. Food and water filters were distributed; filters provided clean water for almost 1,500. Many came to Christ; including 8 families. Five medical clinics were conducted along with ministry in prisons and city jails. Christina led a team to minister to local prostituted women. Thirty were invited and about 80 showed up, plus kids.

Over a 1000 came to Christ and hundreds were healed. More than a hundred Muslims gave their lives to Jesus. Over 1500 were treated in the medical clinics, including one of the biggest clinics we ever conducted, over 700 treated! We distributed 50 water filters, working with distribution centers and schools. The result was that almost 10,000 people have access to clean water. Five thousand of these are school children.

Steve took a team of U.S. company presidents and they worked with small business owners. They rescued women out of prison by paying fines. They also worked with 400 people at a garbage dump ministering and sharing the gospel.

Our small team was able to strategically distribute much needed water filters to the people of Les Cayes and Cavaillon, Haiti as part of Hurricane Matthew relief efforts. Our team of two had the opportunity to pray for people, see miraculous healings and share the Gospel while distributing 255 water filters. It is estimated that around 12,000 people gained access to clean water.

The all women team provided morning devotionals and street outreach. Working with different groups of women, we provided refreshments, gift bags, and spent time hearing their stories. Many were led to Christ. In the slum we provided preventative training for formerly prostituted women and 120 garment industry workers. We distributed about 100 food packages of rice, beans, and oil. We taught English and participated in feeding 180 kids and assisted with day care.

The 1st part of the journey sent the team into three Badi communities. The distribution of 60 water filters opened the door to share the Gospel and minister. Everyone that received prayer got healed. Torrential rains pushed the team into the foothills of the Himalayas. We distributed 40 water filters and worked with schoolaged children. The team lived among the people, eating and sharing for several days.



2016 **DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS**

2016 was a wonderful year. We were able, with the help of all of you, to sow into the lives of many around the world. It is such a blessing to know we are spreading hope and life. Let's take a look at the highlights:

RELIEF WORK:

In the days after Hurricane Matthew we were able to help send a small team to help distribute much needed water filters to the



people of Les Cayes and Cavaillon, Haiti. It is estimated that around 12,000 people gained access to clean water. We were also able to send hygiene kits to serve 300 families at 2 schools to help prevent cholera outbreaks and provide funds for a chainsaw for Pastor Reginald to help serve communities where trees were blocking roads, etc

PERMANENT SCHOOL BUILDING:

The Hope and Care school building was completed in 2016 and in early February 2017 opened in Kalonga, Uganda. This was the culmination of almost 18 months effort—fundraising, building the school facility, and constructing desks for hundreds of children. On the opening day, 500 children showed up! Families from many miles away have moved to Kalonga just so their children could receive and education at the new school. Richard reports a great excitement in the region.

SCHOOL SPONSORSHIP:

Ray of Hope-India, Hope & Care-Uganda, and Centre Vie-Haiti each receive quarterly distributions of funds raised through Child Sponsorship program. In

addition to these three primary school programs, we also sponsored 13 Ugandan students who completed their 1st year of

secondary school. These students were able to attend a secondary school in Mityana where their boarding and supplies were paid for.

REFUGEE CAMP RELIEF:

Impact Nations first visited Sango Bay Resettlement Camp in January of 2016 where deworming medicine and water filters were distributed. A few months later, most of the refugees were moved to a region called Kazinga, where they were left with virtually no shelter and no access to water. We were able to provide safe drinking water to 5000 people through a combination of wells, rain catchment systems, spring boxes, and water filters. 200 tarps were supplied for shelter and 250 children received deworming medicine.

ISAIAH 58 FEEDING PROGRAMS:

Every week, we provide thousands of meals. We help to purchase farmland and provide training for sustainable solutions to hunger. We were able to send tens of thousands of meals to our partner in Haiti and her orphanage, Centre Vie Cevim. The food was supplied by the Ontario Gleaners in Canada and consist of dried vegetable soup, dried apples, granola, beans, and peanuts. This food is enough for 80 kids at the orphanage to have at least one meal a day for a year, with extra to go towards feeding 150 children in three surrounding villages. Additional programs in India and Uganda provide meals for street beggars and orphans.

- Expansion of Farmland at Kalonga and addition of second piggery
- Well drilled at Hope & Care (George's well)
- 2 spring boxes in Kanyegalamire that provide 5000-6000 with water
- Teacher salaries for 4 months for Kalonga
- Nepal school was built. Exterior structures (Roof and walls)
- Goat fencing completed in Haiti
- \$1300 quarterly going to teachers' salaries at Centre Vie, Haiti.
- \$500 sent to Tanzania for pastors and gutter repair/installation
- In 2016 we distributed 1075 sawyer water filters in Cambodia, the Philippines, Haiti, Nepal, Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, Nicaragua and India
- Enough anti-malarial mosquito nets to cover over 4,000 children
- Flew Randeep to Uganda to train pastors and leaders on house church & discipleship




2016 RESULTS

In addition to what we were able to accomplish in 2016, the **2016 Christmas catalog** raised enough for the following:

- 200 Water Filters- access to clean water for at least 600 families.
- Completion of a piggery, complete with 14 pigs, in India that will become a sustainable source of income for a local orphanage.
- Meals for over 2000 people.
- School supplies and uniforms for Centre Vie Orphanage in Haiti.
- 3 teachers' salary covered for a year
- Medicine for over 1300 people
- 14 Girls in Nepal were sponsored to receive training and start small businesses





