# The 92hands Food Bank feeds 100's of families every week.

As mentioned earlier, we had to find a sustainable means of providing food to our target communities for as long as possible. Due to COVID'19, every situation now is very unpredictable.

We started a food bank where people gather every Saturday to pick food that shall take them through the week. It has now become a symbol of hope in these very difficult times. 166 vulnerable families in Kosovo and who couldn't afford to feed their families before are now able to. Each of our food packs can feed a family for a week so that way, they don't have to worry about where their next meal will come from. They too can focus on adapting to the new normal way of life.



## Families like John's.

John is the sole provider for his family of 5, He is a single father, his wife died on their journey to Uganda and he was left with 5 kids to look after as a refugee and a single dad, its not easy to get a job in Kampala to meet the daily needs of his family, He was beyond grateful for this food. he is beyond grateful for you.

Like so many other refugees, John was deep in debt, buying everything to feed his children on credit. But shop owners in the slums would not always extend credit to him, especially with his limited ability to pay the debt back. So skipping meals is a normal part of his children's life.

On better days, there would be lunch. Too often though, there was only water and bread.



The stories we've heard from our refugee friends have broken our hearts and filled them with awe, all at the same time.

*“Brenda had no job, no food, no money. And eight children to feed.”*

Two of her kids still need milk, but there was no way she could afford it. So Brenda did what she had to, in order to ensure her children had whatever nourishment she could find. She mixed bits of bread with tea. Brenda's family wasn't able to get help from other aid groups. In the midst of the slums in Kampala, and opportunity for anything—jobs, education, and yes, even relief—is never easy to come by.

We were one of the first to bring food to the families in Katanga. It was certainly the first food to Brenda received.

This is what you made happen for vulnerable families in the slum not one but two slums in Kampala region.
