Total Impact in Katanga and Kosovo

KATANGA - 210 Families

The 210 Families in Katanga have recieved enough food to feed them for the next 12 days and to the families that were smaller it will take them for 14 days.

You helped feed approximately
1050 People

In total you have helped provide 2940 meals for people in Katanga.

KOSOVO - 200 Families

The 200 Refugee Families in Kosovo have recieved enough food to feed them for the next 12 days and to the families that were smaller it will take them for 14 days.

You helped feed approximately
1000 People

In total you have helped provide 2800 meals for people in Katanga.

1000 Killograms of Rice
2000 Kgs of Beans
400 Litres of Cooking oil
200 Bars of Soap

You provided 5740 meals in Katanga and Kosovo

In Kosovo we selected the most vulnerable and these are refugees who had recently come into Kosovo from Congo, most of these single mothers, young people, the fact that they had just moved into a new community, they were starting afresh, most are unemployed and it's so hard for them to feed themselves, 92 hands and elevate were working with 160 refugees to help before the virus outbreak.

When we beat this virus we will continue our goal to set these people up to move themselves from poverty, toward independence in this new country.

You are helping these people feed their families throughout the pandemic that's hitting them harder in so many different ways



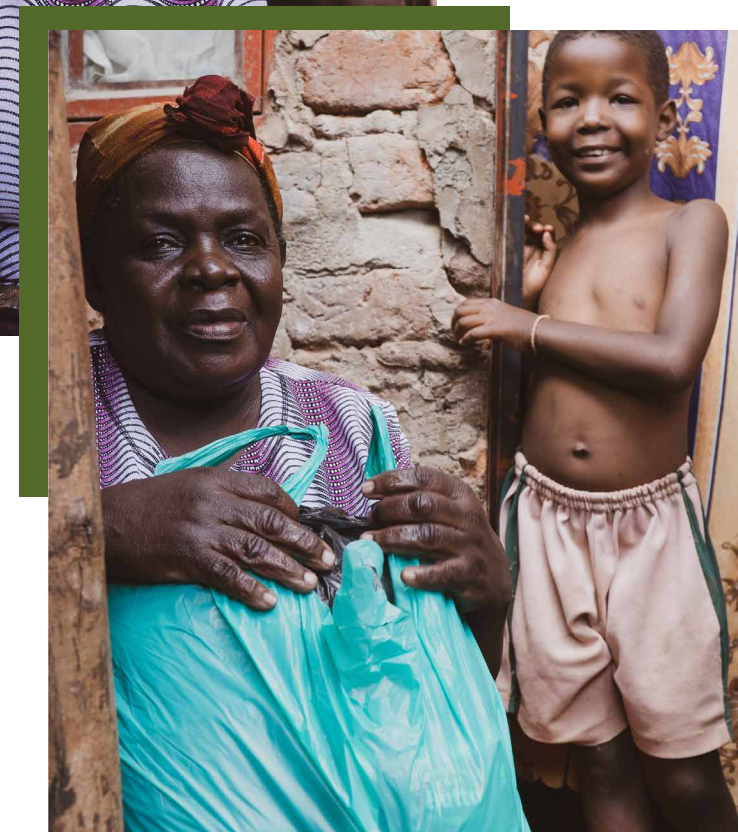
The Food Tickets

The new form of money for people in slums to buy food.

Our country Uganda is on a lock down and above that our president banned NGO's from reaching out to the needy, as 92hands we had to options to let the people in the slums starve or find a way to reach them without violating the law.

The idea of the food ticket was birthed, we realised that people were still allowed to go to the shops but what they didn't have is the money because all their daily labor jobs were gone, so they had no money to even feed themselves.

All the printing shops were closed so we had to handwrite and sign cards with Scriptures at the back.



Meet Zarifah

90% of ugandans are living hand to mouth and it is even worse in the urban slums like Katanga. People call them modern day hunters. Every morning they wake up and go hunting on the streets to see what they can make to feed their families.

Zarifah is one of these ladies who every single day wakes up to hunt for her kids and she is one of the ladies that appeared on the streets being chased by police.

When uganda went on a lock down, Zarifah did not even have a single penny to feed her three kids, she could hunt no more and the husband disappeared to the village leaving her with three kids to take care of.

Just one week in the lock down of 21 days she told us she started digging through trash to see if she can find something to feed her and the childrern, she couldn't.

Zarifah was overwhelmed to receive her package on Saturday as she couldn't believe that someone was out there thinking about her, She mentioned to us that she believes now that she is not alone.

Because of your generosity Zarifah will have food for the next 12-14 Days
