Jennifer Mirembe!

Jennifer is a 32 year old single mother staying in the swampy areas of Busega together with her 4 children.

Her dream was to start up a saloon and give work to her fellow less privileged women in her community.

During her skill's training under the hairdressing class, Jennifer has been encouraged to continue believing in the validity of her dreams.

Jennifer can now plait hair and earn money from this skill, As she awaits graduation, she operates a mobile saloon where she plaits clients door to door.

Nanynage Juliet

Juliet is a 27 year old mother staying in the slums of Kosovo together with her husband and 3 children. Following her husband's financial instability to look after the family, Juliet joined the US4Women program with a goal to attain a skill that will help her support her family and also help pay bills at home.

Juliet enrolled under the tailoring class and right now she is in position to sew different patterns of clothes, fashion and designs and also as she awaits graduation, she has secured a contract with a local community school where she will be making uniforms for the students.





Zainabu Madina.

Madina is a 30 year old single mother staying in the slums of Kosovo together with her 2 children. Her husband deserted the family during the first pandemic outbreak of corona and went back to somalia.

Madina is a refugee from Somalia, and settling in Uganda wasn't easy since she had no friend or family member to rely on. She had to resort to washing clothes for people to earn a living. But her wage wasnt enough to help her pay bills and also look after her children.

She joined the Hairdressing class, and devoted herself to learning all she could to make her life better. Right now Madina can plait different hairstyles and can make a living from this skill. She is not scared about her children's future anymore.

After graduation, Madina's dream is to start up a saloon in her community and also train fellow refugee women on how to make a living.



Akankunda Prossy

Prossy is a 18 year old lady staying in the slums of Namungoona together with her mother and 4 siblings. She dropped out of school due to lack of school fees since she had to sacrifice for her young siblings to study.

Her mother often encouraged her to get married and be able to support her siblings since it was her only shot at life left. But Prossy believed that there was a better future for her than just getting married at a tender age.

Joining the Hairdressing class, Prossy passionately concentrated on how to plait different hairstyles, from cornrows, pencil styles, wigs, weaves to normal braiding. Right now she can attend to a client without the support of her trainers.

We are excited about Prossy's next chapter in life because it just got started. She made the right choice of choosing to be skilled.







US4Women Shelter Katanga 23

20% of the 45 million Ugandan citizens live below the poverty line in urban centres, slum communities make up for 60% of the population, and Katanga is one of the biggest urban slums in Kampala. It is characterised by poor housing facilities, drainage systems, illiteracy, substance abuse, unemployment and high crime rate in addition to the crippling poverty.

After a handful of surveys, we noticed that providing aid to the women in this community wasn't a sustainable plan, we had to teach them how to fish on their own so that they would be able to provide for their families.

Hence extending the US4Women skills training programs to Katanga. If only the women and young girls from this slum can attain a skill, their lives can change for the better.

Among the skills that will be taught include Tailoring, Hairdressing, Baking and decoration, catering and makeup classes.

So far we have recruited over 100 women in katanga, and we believe by the grace of God, their lives will not remain the same.



US4WOMEN LOANS

This year, we issued out loans to over 30 women operating small scale businesses in Kosovo and Katanga. Following a week of financial literacy courses and trainings, women learnt the different investment patterns, profits and losses and Customer care services

We started with an annual plan to create and revamp the businesses of the women under our program whereby each received a loan of \$100 after attaining the skills and financial knowledge to invest in different businesses that they are well skilled.

Each woman's business is assessed to understand the accurate amount of money needed to run the business. And during the assessment, each woman is required to come up with a budget that would justify why they need a \$100 loan for their identified business. This ensures that the loans are distributed fairly.
