PLANNING

As a group leader, one of the most important investments you will make in your group is *prayerful planning*. This planning does not only happen at the beginning of your group's journey together but should also be an ongoing leadership commitment that you pursue.

The fact that we need to plan is important but the more important question is: how can we as group leaders be used by God to bring about *His* plan? God has a plan and a purpose for every single member of our group. Isaiah 55:9 says, "His ways are higher than our ways and His thoughts are higher than our thoughts."

So, let us consider how we can be engaged in the work that God has prepared before hand for us to walk in (Ephesians 2:10).

PLAN PRAYERFULLY

Your primary role as a group leader is prayer. Let everything that you do and dream of for your group be bathed in intimate conversation with the Lord who is in control of all things. We often think, "Let's plan and then ask God to bless our plans." But what if we became men who didn't move forward without the Lord's direction. What if we became men who trusted God at His every word and followed Him obediently in how we lead our groups?

PLAN COLLECTIVELY

It is easy as a group leader to think, "for the sake of time and to make things easy I will just do everything myself." But this is not the type of leadership that we want to build. First, we want to ensure that our planning always happens alongside a co-leader. Second, we want to involve our group members in part of the planning process. After you and your co-leader have sought the Lord and come up with a plan, bring this plan to your group, pray together, and seek their input.

PLAN RHYTHMICALLY

Here are some recommended planning rhythms for you to build into your life as a group leader:

Every man is in search of satisfaction. And so often men find themselves going to wells that only provide water that does not *truly* satisfy and to which they have to keep returning over and over. This swampy, unsatisfying water could come in the form of work, or sex, or pride, or many other things. Ultimately these worldly things will never provide the satisfaction that a man truly needs.

Jesus Christ is the only one who can provide the full and lasting satisfaction that every man desperately needs. Every page of **the Bible** points us to Him.

This is why it is vital that as you plan for your first two years, you make it your commitment to ensure that you bring the water of the **word of God** before your group *every single week*.

GROUP HEALTH CHECK



Below, you will find questions that will help inform your consideration of what material to work through as a group. Ask these questions with your co-leader before deciding on material for the year.

As you and your co-leader work through these questions and consider what material will be most appropriate for the season you are planning for, ensure that the material you choose is Bible focused and will point your group members back to Jesus. Consider these questions together every time you prayerfully plan for a new season.

GROUP HEALTH CHECK:

RELATIONAL. SPIRITUAL. MISSIONAL.

- Is attendance consistent and is commitment high?
- Is the trust strong, and the sharing deep and real?
- Are the men connecting outside of weekly group time?
- Are you consistently practicing the "one anothers"?
- Is there evidence of spiritual growth in each man?
- Are you providing the men with a nourishing, balanced diet?
- Are the men spending quality time with God each day?
- Has your group become isolated and self-focused?
- Are you missional; caring, giving, serving, discipling?
- Are the men attending and serving in their local church?
- What is your next level as a group?

LAUNCH - SESSION TWO

The purpose of Year One is that your group would establish a strong foundation, set a vision for what the group will be about, and agree to wholeheartedly pursue that vision (LAUNCH). Year One will also help you establish healthy, authentic relationships with one another by providing opportunity to hear one another's life stories (My Story Retreat), and explore together the fabrics that make up spiritual friendships (LAUNCH)

and Everybody's Normal 'Till You Get to Know Them). Year One also provides opportunities for group members to have a foundational understanding of the gospel of Jesus Christ and His free gift of grace (How Good is Good Enough). Finally, Year One provides an opportunity for the group to tackle one of the biggest threats to a man's spiritual growth in our culture today: Sexual Sin (Surfing for God).



A 10-WEEK JOURNEY INTO RELATIONAL CHRISTIANITY

Establishing a foundation for life transformation starts with *LAUNCH:*A 10-Week Journey into Relational Christianity where the group experiences Jesus' plan for community.

Launch is the essential starting place for every Nextlevel Group. It helps your group explore the crisis of male isolation and helps set a vision for a remedy to that problem. It considers what true Biblical community is all about.



It presents a new kind of accountability founded on encouragement and geared toward inviting the input of trusted friends.

It culminates in the formation of a group covenant; a founding commitment that will guide your group for years to come.


MY STORY RETREAT

Immediately after the group has completed LAUNCH is a great time to do the My Story Retreat. Whether your group goes on a classic night-away retreat to complete the process or they choose to do it over multiple weeks on their regular group night, the My Story Retreat model, provided by Nextlevel will take your group to the Nextlevel in each man knowing every other man's life story. Each man comes away from this experience having a deeper understanding of the formative moments in his own life as well as in the life of his brothers in his group. This experience is an important aspect of developing authentic spiritual friendships.



EVERYBODY'S NORMAL 'TILL YOU GET TO KNOW THEM

Following the retreat, the group spends time digging deeper into the scriptural concepts found in Everybody's Normal 'Tiil You Get to Know Them by John Ortberg. You will probably recognize two chapters of this book which are both covered in LAUNCH. It is recommended that groups go through this book in the first year of their journey together because groups often need more practice and focus on the principles that they learned and established during LAUNCH.





HOW GOOD IS GOOD ENOUGH


As your group pursues Christ together, it is vital that you have a clear and unified understanding of the saving work of Christ. How Good is Good Enough? by Andy Stanley provides logical reasons and Biblical evidence for why Christ is the only Way to God. Stanley emphasizes that salvation is a free gift from God that cannot be earned.





SURFING FOR GOD

Sexual Purity is a key topic that most men deal with. Surfing for God helps men see that they could be using sex to try to fill a hole in their hearts that only God can fill. Sexual sin is a common barrier for men as they seek to grow in spiritual maturity partly because of the shame and identity struggles that it causes. It is a key topic for your group to cover as you move forward in your pursuit of Christlikeness.



YEAR ONE RHYTHMS

FUN NIGHTS

Plan a fun night once every 6-8 weeks or so to enjoy some less structured time of fellowship together.
As you build relationship, it is important and healthy to invest in ways for you and your group members to get to know each other in different environments.

FOOD

There is something life-giving about eating together. We would encourage you to keep up the habit of having snacks or food to share during your meetings each week. Have each person in the group be in charge of food for each respective week.

SERVICE


Ask the Lord how you might serve together and build it into your schedule every 6-8 weeks. Service is a key way for your group to grow in relationship while investing in the kingdom. It also encourages your group to look outside itself at the greater needs of the body of Christ.


SUMMER

Remember that relationship and spiritual needs are present in the summer just as much (sometimes more) than in the non-summer months. Also, remember that summer is an important time for you and your group members to rest. You can use the summer months to "switch it up".

Here are a few suggestions:

- One Week Study, One Week Fun. Many groups decide that throughout the summer they are going to operate on an alternating schedule for their group meetings. One week is considered a "fun night" where some fun activity is planned for people to do together. The following week is a sharing and praying night. This rhythm is repeated throughout the summer.
- Take a break as a leader. Have your group members take turns leading and planning the summer months.
- Invest in each other outside of group time. Often summer affords more flexibility. Encourage your group to use this flexibility to be pursuing each other outside of group time in a way they may not be able to during more busy months.
- **Group Retreat.** Plan an extended time away as a group at least once a year.

As you plan, don't forget the planning principles on page 4-8.


Always start your year by reviewing the covenant and talking together about how the group has been doing in each of the areas outlined in the covenant.

Discernment on the part of the group leaders will be needed when it comes to determining what topics are most important and what material to choose.













GOSPEL



SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES


DONALD S. WHITNEY - SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

This is a great book for your Nextlevel group to go through together early on in your journey as you seek to become more Christlike in your manhood.





The writer of Hebrews has important things to say to believers about the importance of Christian community.




PHILIPPIANS 2
