First Lesson – The Fall (Genesis 3:8-15)

"When they heard the sound of the Lord God walking about in the garden at the breezy time of the day the man and his wife hid themselves from the Lord God among the trees of the garden. The Lord God then called to the man and asked him: Where are you? He answered, "I heard you in the garden; but I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid." Then God asked: Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I had forbidden you to eat? I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; They will strike at your head, while you strike at their heel."

<u>Second Lesson</u> — The King Is Coming (Jeremiah 23:5-8)

"See, days are coming—oracle of the Lord— when I will raise up a righteous branch for David; As king he shall reign and govern wisely, he shall do what is just and right in the land. In his days Judah shall be saved, Israel shall dwell in security. This is the name to be given him: "The Lord our justice." Therefore, the days are coming—oracle of the Lord—when they shall no longer say, "As the Lord lives, who brought the Israelites out of the land of Egypt"; but rather, "As the Lord lives, who brought the descendants of the house of Israel up from the land of the north"—and from all the lands to which I banished them; they shall again live on their own soil."

Prayer: Lord, you promised that your reign would bring the justice that would never end. May we help to bring this justice in our time. Amen.

<u>Fourth Lesson</u> — A Child Is Born To Us (Isaiah 9:1-6)

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing; They rejoice before you as people rejoice at harvest, as they exult when dividing the spoils. For the yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder, The rod of their taskmaster, you have smashed, as on the day of Midian. For every boot that tramped in battle, every cloak rolled in blood, will be burned as fuel for fire. For a child is born to us, a son is given to us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. 


Away In A Manger

<u>Eight Lesson</u> — The Word Became Flesh (John 1:1-14)

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. A man named John was sent from God. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him.
