

MISSION: To provide emergency food to needy people in the State College Area and to assist the network of food pantries in Centre County.

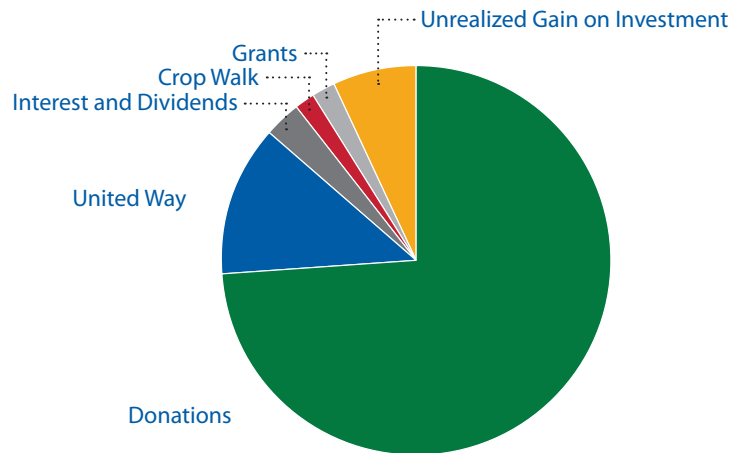
The State College Area Food Bank's service area encompasses seven townships in the Centre Region and the Borough of State College. We also assist social service agencies and other Centre County Food Pantry's by providing food to their clients through our Centre Sorting re-donation program.

SERVICES PROVIDED/OPERATIONS

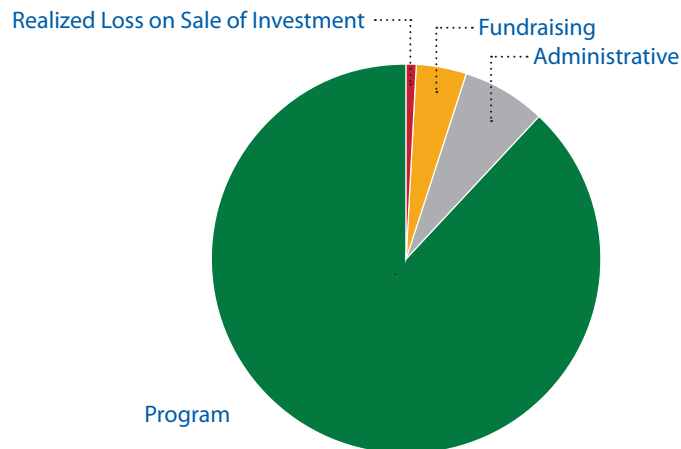
- ▶ A household can receive services once every 30 days, with a referral from a Community Safety Net member organization.
- ▶ During the months of November and December, extra holiday bags/turkeys are distributed during regular hours.
- ▶ A client receives a supply of groceries sufficient for approximately 7 - 10 days. The size of the food order corresponds to the number of people in the household. In addition to the non-perishable foods, every grocery order includes shelf-stable milk, fresh eggs and frozen meats. Fresh vegetables, day-old breads, personal hygiene and cleaning products, baby food/baby supplies are also provided as available.
- ▶ In 2012, the Food Bank received over 253,973 pounds of donated food. Food is acquired through community food drives (from local churches, schools and The Pennsylvania State University) as well as from individual giving. In addition, the Food Bank receives food from the following:
 - Federal Emergency Food Assistance Program
 - State Food Purchase Program
 - Central Pennsylvania Food Bank (Feeding America Program)
 - "Stamp Out Hunger" organized by USPS letter carriers (Spring)
 - "Scouting for Food" organized by the Boy Scouts (Fall)
 - In 2012, 821 unique households (includes households of all sizes) visited the Food Bank for services for a total of 3,184 visits.
 - Regular client service hours are Monday from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m., Wednesday and Friday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. and from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the second Saturday of each month. Emergency food provided by our food bank is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week through the Community Help Center (814.237.5855 or 800.494.2500). A total of 14,491 prepacked bags were distributed during these visits.
- Approximately 37% of the household included children and another 10% were over the age of 60.
- Approximately 2,126 people comprise the 821 unique households.
- Of the 2,126 people, approximately 180 people used the Food Bank for the first time in 2012.
- ▶ The Food Bank has a re-donation program to assure that food reaches those that need it the most by re-donating food. Agencies/Organizations that benefit from the re-donation program are:

- ▶ Staff includes the Executive Director and Operations Coordinator (both positions are full time). In addition, 60 regular volunteers help us on a weekly basis. Volunteers logged approximately 8,010 hours in 2012.
