ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Ted Junker '59 hosts a good time called "The Sig Gig"

For the past three years in the winter months, a group of Sigma Chi brothers and sweethearts met on Marco Island, Florida for something aptly named the "Sig Gig". The Sig Gig is usually well attended and is the perfect prelude to spring.

This year's Sig Gig was hosted by Ted Junker '59, and attended by Jim Keith '58, Jay Corrigan '57, Dick Mohler '57, John Haas '58, Norb Connors '60, Dave Morrow '59, Dan Johnston '61, and Jim Faunce '57 with three former sweethearts also in attendance, Fran Cox Nodland '57, Joanne "Toots" Yergey Keith '58 and Larrian Johnston '61. We reached out to Ted Junker for some perspective on the Sig Gig and his experiences with Sigma Chi.

The "Sig Gig," named by Fran Cox Nodland, came to fruition three years ago at Junker's Marco Island home. Many of the other attendees live around the Greater Naples Area, roughly 17 miles away. Nodland and Junker set the date back in December, well before the holiday season and made sure to include a little "save the date" when they mailed their Christmas cards this year.

During their visit, the Sig Gig attendees spent most of their time on the beautiful lanai in Junker's backyard and listened to music, a scene he calls the "ideal setting". Since there were three former sweethearts in attendance, the men ended the "Sig Gig" by serenading the women with the "Sweetheart of Sigma Chi" song!

For those needing a place to stay, Junker, Keith and Corrigan graciously opened their homes and guest bedrooms. The three live in close proximity, but there are others who come from around the area; some travel as far as 50 and 70 miles away to attend. While these alumni live relatively close together, the Sig Gig is a great place to meet up yearly.

Back in Junker's days at Penn State, there were only five fraternities on campus and the Sigma

Chi house was less than a block away from Rec Hall, right across the street from Fiji and next to Sigma Nu. Amongst other reasons, Junker found that all the



guys in the fraternity, while rushing, were guys that he liked, which made it easy. On top of that, the location of the house was ideal and convenient, so it seemed like a no brainer. Today, this is where the IST building resides on campus.

The fall of 1955 was a time that changed the way Ted's time at Penn State would unfold as a brother of Sigma Chi, particularly, the day of his initiation. "The ritual leaves a lifetime impression and is one of my favorite memories," stated Junker.

Coupled with the story of his initiation, Junker also said, "I remember participating in subsequent initiations and I had a couple of little brothers. Even when I got married, my big brother **Bob Scrabis '59** was there. There were a few other Sigma Chi brothers in my wedding.

Jim Keith '58 was my roommate for two years and was also in my wedding party. Also, Phil Reese '57 who was a pledge brother of mine was in my wedding but he unfortunately passed away at a young age. I'm very fortunate to have had many close friends to share these memorable moments in my life."

Since graduating from Penn State, Junker spent a career in banking. He ran his own bank as chairman and CEO in Erie, Pennsylvania called Marine Bank. Eventually, he sold this bank and worked for PNC as a

vice-chairman and board member of PNC, from where he retired. While working in Erie, PA Junker was very involved with the Penn State Behrend Campus. He and his late wife gave a gift to the Behrend campus and have a center that carries their name,

The Junker Center, which plays host for many athletic events and training facilities for both men and women.

Junker graduated from the University Park campus and thoroughly enjoys attending alumni events there. He typically attends the Golf Outing, but was sad to say that he can't attend this year. He previously attended and formed an eight-man group referred to as the "AARP 4," named by Jim Keith.

Regardless of the golf outing, Ted is proud to say that he has kept in close contact with many of his brothers from Sigma Chi. He visits with many of them when they are in Florida and it is always a pleasure to see and speak with them. As for the Sig Gig, the plans are to continue the Sig Gig next winter and to invite those who couldn't make it this time due to scheduling conflicts.

A last note from Ted, he would like spare a few words of advice for the active chapter: Study hard and don't do anything to endanger the integrity of Sigma Chi. "I think they're doing a really good job with the house and I am happy to be able to financially support it," said Junker in reference to all of the renovations that have been done over the past few years.
