



2017 Queenan Fellowships for Global Health Recipients

The Foundation for SMFM is pleased to announce that the 2017 Queenan Fellowships for Global Health have been awarded to the following individuals:



Dr. Megan Foeller, a second-year Maternal-Fetal Medicine Fellow at Stanford University, is the recipient of the **International Agency Mentored Research Fellowship** and will spend six months in Geneva beginning in March 2018. While there she will be involved in multi-country, multicenter research projects and international guideline development on key maternal and perinatal health areas; she also will participate in international meetings and conferences. She has a long-standing interest in infectious diseases in pregnancy and aspirations to help reduce the impact of infectious disease in low-resource communities worldwide.



Dr. Rebekah McCurdy, a third-year Maternal-Fetal Medicine Fellow at Thomas Jefferson University, is the recipient of the **Visiting Teaching Fellowship** and will spend two months as a visiting faculty member at Koutiala Women and Babies Hospital in Koutiala, Mali in the spring of 2018. She will interact with their staff and physicians through lectures, presentations and low-cost simulations in high-risk obstetrics relevant to resource-limited settings. She is motivated to teach not only because of compassion, but because mentoring others is key to sustainable change.
