## **Qualifications:**

- Pursuing or completed B.S. degree in Wildlife Biology or related field preferred.
- Basic waterfowl identification.
- Ability to work on a team and maintain a positive attitude.

## Preferred experience in and/or knowledge of:

- Basic knowledge of CWA Programs
- Ability to identify, age and sex waterfowl in alternative and breeding plumage.
- Comfortable operating 4x4 vehicles, ATVs, and capable of towing and backing equipment trailers
- Experience with waterfowl surveys, nest searching, and nest monitoring
- Ability to keep organized data records, problem solve, and work as a team
- Experience working with private landowners, State and Federal staff.
- Computer skills and knowledge of word processing, spreadsheets, and database software (Microsoft office)
- Waterfowl surveys and nest monitoring

### Major Job Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Work cooperatively on waterfowl crew to conduct surveys, nest searches, and nest monitoring.
- 2. Help staff with Egg Salvage, Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program, and Wood Duck Programs.
- 3. Basic animal husbandry at partner Egg Salvage hatcheries; includes sexing, banding, and releasing ducklings.
- 4. Monitor wood duck nest boxes, conduct waterfowl surveys, field nest searches, nest monitoring, and egg salvaging.
- 5. Maintain equipment throughout the season and upkeep relations with the CDFW, USGS, and private landowners who cooperate with our various programs.
- 6. Maintain accurate data records of salvaging efforts, field searches, nests encountered, bird surveys, and band data.
- 7. A company vehicle will be provided.

### **Desired Skills:**

- 1. Federal MOCC general boating certification and airboat operation certification.
- 2. Drone operation and commercial drone license.
- 3. Must be able to maintain accurate data records and have good communication skills.
- 4. Must be able to comfortably use tools and equipment including wrenches, hammers, power drills, etc.
- 5. Must have the ability to lift 15lbs overhead and 50lbs to knees, stand for extended periods of time, and endure extreme climates.
- 6. Ability to work long irregular hours including weekends.
- 7. Must be able to traverse unpaved and unmarked trails while carrying supplies (wood duck boxes, poles, ladders, etc).
