Wood ducks have come back from the

brink of extinction thanks to conservation efforts such as providing nest boxes that help compensate for the loss of riparian breeding habitat. California Waterfowl created the California Wood Duck Program in 1991 to increase both the number of nest boxes on the landscape and citizen involvement in the fate of wood ducks. More than 845,000 ducklings have leapt from the program's boxes, and with thousands of volunteers, this program is the biggest citizen science effort of its kind.

California Wood Duck Program volunteer Jim Dunn helps manage 72 boxes in an area called Orr Ranch. Whenever he finds a very recent hatch, he goes out early the next day to photograph the jump. had to chuckle when my dad asked me to enroll him in the California Wood Duck Program so he could install a nest box in his back yard.

You see, he lives at 6,200 feet in Tahoe—not exactly the wood duck breeding mecca for California.

But when I thought about it, I realized maybe it wasn't so far-fetched.

When I grew up in Tahoe, I didn't hunt waterfowl and wasn't familiar with the various species or their sounds. After I moved away for school, though, I became an avid waterfowl hunter, and eventually a waterfowl biologist. During visits home, I never saw a wood duck in the back yard, but I thought for sure I heard them a few times.

(age 1 at the time).

Tahoe is at the edge of wood duck breeding range, so it would not be uncommon

to find them in the area. But this would be California Waterfowl's first wood duck project in Tahoe.

The timing was good: The big winter of 2016-17 had created several ponds in the back yard, which is on Trout Creek Meadow. So we put up a nest box and hoped for the best.

I was really surprised when Mom called in April to tell me there was a wood duck nesting in the box.

What is so neat about this box is that it's not what I am used to as a biologist—checking boxes usually involves long quad rides and walking through mud and muck. This box you can see from my parents' dining room.

Mom and Dad watched each morning as the drake waited in the pond for the hen. They learned the feeding patterns and watched as the hen flew out in the morning and again in the late afternoon. She laid 14 eggs, of which 12 hatched.

The Huber family did it right: starting small and expanding as they watched the investment pay off. He promises not to laugh!

Looks like Mom and Dad had the right idea after all!

But it didn't stop there. In June, my parents noticed new activity around the box. When I came up to visit, I was surprised to find a hen with seven eggs. I hadn't brought my banding gear with me, though, so I called



in a favor from one of our most experienced volunteer banders who happened to be going to Tahoe that week, Robert Franco. On July 2, Robert banded our hen, and five ducklings hatched later that month.

This was great, but the big question was would they return the following year? Even though the winter was not nearly as wet, a beaver dam on the creek flooded

the meadow and created more ponds. On April 3, my Mom saw the first wood duck pair on the pond. She kept a diary and noted their activity each day. I came to visit in May and found our banded hen in the box with nine eggs. We decided to put up a second box, this time right outside the kitchen window.

On May 30, seven ducklings hatched from Box 1.

In early June I visited again and cleaned out Box 1 and checked Box 2. Again, I was pleasantly surprised to find a small female in the box with four eggs. I banded her, and my parents watched her come and go until July 2, when my Mom videotaped the "jump" from her kitchen window as the four ducklings left the nest.

This spring, we are hoping for their return. I even got my mom a wifi-enabled security camera to put inside the box to see if we can catch even more action.

It just goes to show you: Your idea for a wood duck project might seem crazy at first, but if you give it a try, you might be pleasantly surprised. R

WINNING A GUN IS GREAT. DONATING ONE MIGHT BE EVEN BETTER!

After experiencing the thrill of winning a gun at a CWA dinner, 16-yearold Ben Broadley has wanted others to feel that same joy.

So for the past several years, he has made that happen, donating a youth gun to be raffled off at the California Wood Duck Program dinner (to be held April 13 this year).

The guns he has donated have been earned through his family's dedication to charitable giving. Modeled after a program at his father Steve's workplace, Ben's hours spent volunteering accrue him a dollar amount from his parents, up to \$300 per year, that he can then donate to a cause of his choice.

And that choice was a no-brainer for Ben. Since he was 10, the Broadleys have been involved in managing wood duck projects. They've had as many as 94 boxes over four projects and currently manage three projects with 79 boxes.

With so many boxes to cover, Ben has enlisted the help of many friends, blind partners, Boy Scouts and even CWA staff, helping to spread the mission of California Wood Duck Program to others.

Beyond helping the ducks, managing the boxes has also been a great educational opportunity for Ben. He has given several presentations on his conservation efforts, ranging from the classroom to the City of Vacaville's Community Services Commission.

Ben hopes to continue with the program for many years, eventually taking full control of his projects. "The idea of conservation beyond hunting has become such a huge part of my life as an outdoorsman," he said.

MAKING TIME IN KIDS' BUSY SCHEDULES

With so many time commitments facing families these days, especially organized youth sports, it can be easy for volunteer activities to get lost in the shuffle. Jim Paroli is ready for it, though.

Following a successful Tigers T-ball game, Paroli got his grandson Jack, still in uniform, up the ladders to check on the wood duck boxes he helps manage with the California Wood Duck Program.

Working with waterfowl has been in the family blood for a long time. Paroli, who is chair of the California Wood Duck Program, first went hunting with his father at age 10 and took his own children out when they were young. He loved being in the marsh, and getting involved with nest boxes was a way to extend that opportunity.

Starting with his first box in 2000 on McDonald Island, Paroli grew the number of boxes there to 60. Now he is now hands-on with 10 other projects, monitoring more than 450 boxes, and giving him the satisfaction of knowing he helps hatch more ducks than he harvests.

The other big joy he gets from the California Wood Duck Program is getting youth involved. Jack loves climbing the ladder to count the eggs or riding out to see habitat improvements.

Paroli is counting down the days until Jack's younger brother Grayson and cousin Elli can join in the fun.

"As outdoor enthusiasts it is our obligation to take any opportunity to share and educate the next generation," he says.

2019 BELLROSE AWARD RECIPIENTS ANTHONY AND JOHN IACCARINO



The California Wood Duck Program honors brothers Anthony and John Iaccarino as joint recipients of the 2019 Bellrose Award.

The laccarinos have been involved in the California Wood Duck Program for 27 years, since the very beginning, and they have attended every wood duck banquet except one. They are major donors to the annual event and have contributed thousands of dollars to the Wood Duck Program over the years.

They're major supporters of California Waterfowl as well: Anthony is a Life Benefactor and John is a Life Donor.

The laccarinos' active project is Green Valley Creek in Sonoma County. In addition, they worked with Bob Benotti to run the San Joaquin Farms Wood Duck Project for at least 10 years, producing more than 800 ducklings from 200 boxes until their project area flooded due to a damaged levee.

These brothers' consistent support of the California Wood Duck Program is what makes them this year's recipients of the Bellrose Award.

Dr. Frank C. Bellrose was one of the pioneers of wood duck nesting research. His career-long commitment to understanding wood duck biology began in the late 1930s and resulted in the development of predatorresistant nest boxes. His lifelong dedication to waterfowl, especially the wood duck, is why the California Wood Duck Program honors one outstanding volunteer in his name each year.


