The Flynn Unit: The Flynn Unit is a 259-acre site located in the southeastern corner of Glenn County just south of the Llano Seco Rancho. One group of hunters will be drawn per hunt date.

Special Conditions: Decoys and blinds are provided.

Hunt details:

- **Hunt Date: Check-in, 1 hour before legal shoot time. Please do not be late for check-in.**
- Note: All hunters and guests need to register *individually* using the Hunt Confirmation link. Please forward registration link to all guest hunters. Hunts canceled due to flooding or unforeseen conditions will not be made up or refunded
- You will be hunting in a pop up blind pre determined by guide.
- We will provide decoys but feel free to bring your own.
- Hunt ends at Noon
- **Please print and sign waiver attached to last page of packet.**

What to bring:

- Recommended: All hunting gear, including valid hunting license, Upland Game Validation, ear and eye protection, non toxic ammunition, gun, gun case, camouflage jacket, hat, gloves, food/drinks, and warm clothes

When you arrive:

- You will be checked-in by a California Waterfowl representative.
- **Note:** If you arrive early please wait in your vehicle until a CWA representative arrives
- Keep guns locked up in your vehicle until ready to leave for the blind in the morning.

From Heading North on I5

- Take I5-N to CA-20
- Take exit 587 toward CA-20
- Take right on offramp
- Continue 8.4 miles on CA-20E
- Turn left on market St. in Colusa
- Continue for 20.2 miles. Road will turn into Biggs-Willows Rd
- Turn left onto Afton Blvd
- Continue for 4 miles to meeting point

From Heading South on I5

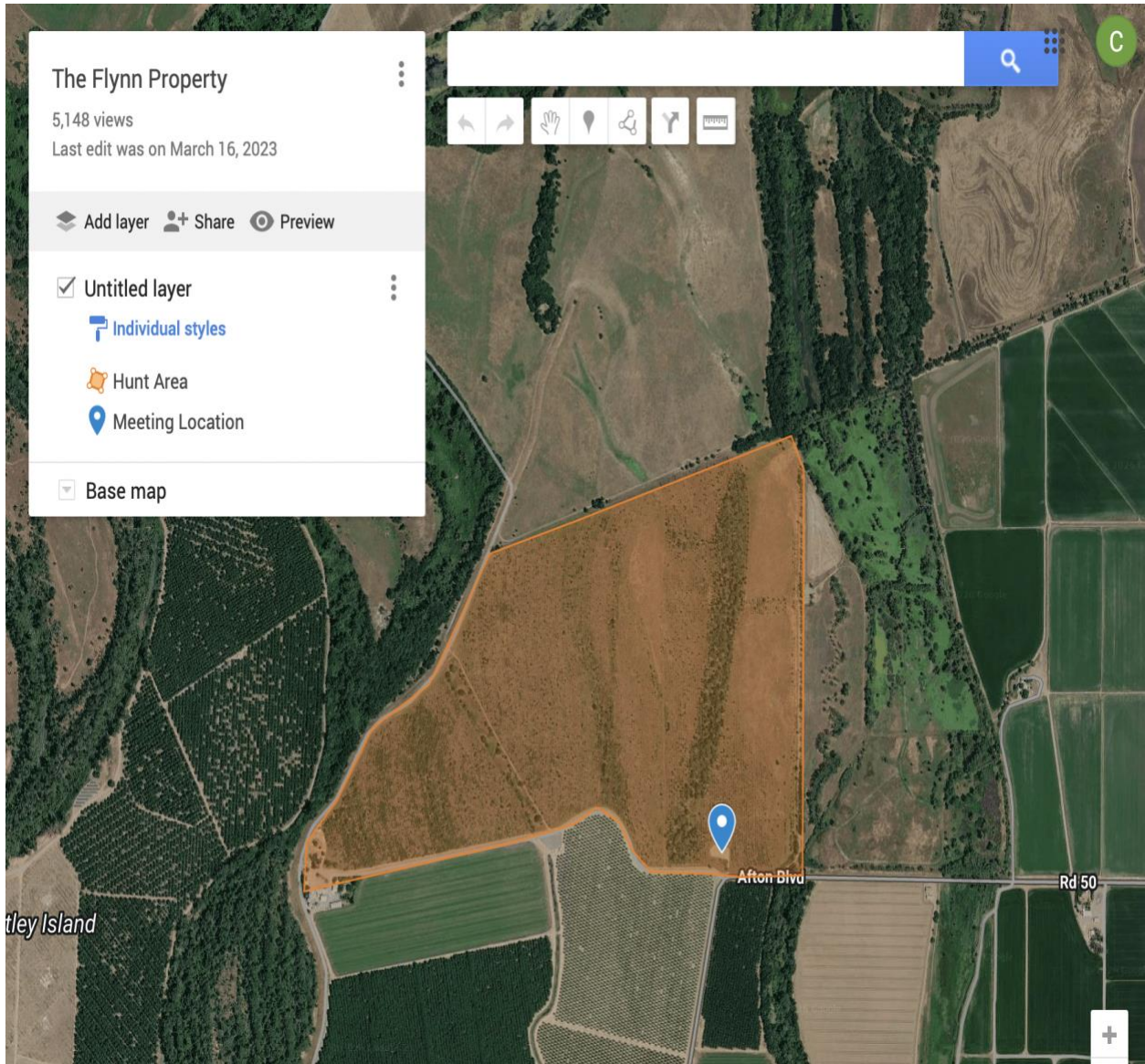
- Continue on I5-S
- Take exit 601
- Turn left on offramp
- Continue for 0.3 miles
- Turn right on Hwy 99 W
- Continue for 2 miles
- Turn left onto Road 60
- Continue for 12.7 miles. Road will turn into Biggs-Willows Rd
- Turn left onto Afton Blvd
- Continue for 4 miles to meeting point

From Heading North on 99

- Take CA-99 N
- Turn left onto CA-162 W
- Continue 14.9 miles on CA-162 W
- Turn right onto Afton Blvd
- Continue for 4 miles to meeting point

From Heading South on 99

- Take CA-99 S
- Turn right onto CA-162 W
- Continue 14.9 miles on CA-162 W
- Turn right onto Afton Blvd
- Continue for 4 miles to meeting point





The Flynn Unit Pop Up Blind – Instructions

1. You must stay in your popup blind while hunting. **Be courteous of other hunters.**
2. Noon end of hunt. If you pick up before noon please call the Onsite Hunt Coordinator.
3. Staff will help you out of the blind if needed
4. All trash and empty shell casings need to be picked up. **Please leave the blind better than you found it**
5. The decoys need to be picked up and given back to coordinator.
6. Be sure to pick up all gear you brought with you
7. If you need to contact the onsite coordinator for any reason, use your cell phone

Blind safety rules

1. Muzzle pointed in a safe direction – ALWAYS!!!
2. Finger off the trigger until ready to shoot – ALWAYS
3. Make sure the safety is on until you are ready to shoot – ALWAYS
4. Open the actions when hunters/dogs are retrieving game, no shooting at cripples and flying birds when dog/hunters are out of blind
5. Shooters “Safe zone of fire” should be established in front of shooter, not behind or over anyone’s head. Use the imaginary clock example of 10 o’clock and 2 o’clock in front of the shooter. Talk about where each shooter will be shooting prior to the start of shoot time



The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety

1. Treat every gun as if it were loaded
2. Watch that Muzzle! Be able to control the direction of the muzzle at all times
3. Be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions
4. Be sure of your target before you pull the trigger
5. Unload guns when not in use
6. Never point a gun at anything you do not intend to shoot
7. Never climb a fence or tree or jump a ditch with a loaded gun
8. Never shoot a bullet at a flat, hard surface or water
9. Store guns and ammunition separately, beyond the reach of children and careless adults
10. Do not drink alcoholic beverages or use mind altering drugs before or during shooting

ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to enter onto property owned by River Partners, a California non-profit corporation, to engage in hunting and related activities on _____, 20____, I agree:

1. I acknowledge and agree that hunting is inherently dangerous and may result in injury, death and loss of property resulting from the negligence or misconduct of others, mishandling of firearms, inclement weather, the uneven nature of the terrain, whether natural or caused by humans, water hazards, mud, fallen vegetation and other obstructions, insects and other hazards found in outdoor settings. River Partners and its agents and contractors shall have no responsibility for any loss or injury which I may suffer as a result of such hazards. I acknowledge that unless I conduct my activity with due regard to potential hazards to be found on the property and the conduct of others, whether or not known to me, I may be subject to personal injury, death and/or loss of property. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF SUCH HAZARDS, BOTH KNOWN AND UNKNOWN, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OR NOT ANY LOSS IS CAUSED BY OR CONTRIBUTED TO BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF, OR FAILURE TO WARN BY, RIVER PARTNERS OR ITS AGENTS OR CONTRACTORS.

2. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, I RELEASE RIVER PARTNERS, ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS AND CONTRACTORS FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR INJURY TO ME OR TO MY PROPERTY, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE CONDITION OF ITS PROPERTY OR THE NEGLIGENCE OF, OR FAILURE TO WARN BY, RIVER PARTNERS OR ITS AGENTS OR CONTRACTORS OR THE NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OF OTHER PERSONS ON SUCH PROPERTY.

3. THIS ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND RELEASE SHALL BE BINDING ON ME AND MY HEIRS, ADMINISTRATORS, PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVES AND SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST.
