When you meet Marc, you see the joy in him. He has an enthusiasm for life that helps people open up to him.

Conversations start easily, even with strangers on the street. He listens, and he genuinely cares. It has not always been this way.

Marc grew up in a faith-based family with plenty of trauma and pain going on. Drugs and alcohol numbed the pain for a while but things went from bad to worse. His marriage collapsed, driving him into a deep depression.

He knew God was there for him, but he described his relationship with God as like a balloon on a long string ... slowly drifting further and further away.

Marc knew he had to take action, so he entered a strict recovery program, but something was still missing. He couldn't face the world. There was no confidence. No love. No joy. Then he came to Open Door with a conviction to draw closer to Christ.

Marc says, "Open Door has helped me change my perception of life. I am learning how to call on Christ and use my past to help others."

Today, he is a changed man with a light inside him. He has a new job and is active in his church. He loves to talk about Jesus. It just seems to happen. "Most times, people don't want to talk about Jesus right away. But I spend some time with them, get to know them, and then I can share the joy God has given me!"

As Marc continues his time at Open Door Mission, he has plans to help others. "I want to start a program where kids

can get a free breakfast and people can get the things they need to get through their day."

His generous nature has a lot to do with you, the donor. He tells us, "Without the donors, the people at Open Door would not be getting the help they really need. Thank you for the help you give me, so I can learn how to give it back to others."
