Letter from Executive Director Anna Valeria-Iseman and Board Chair Vivek Thiagarajan

Through God's grace, 2021 was a tremendously successful year for Open Door Mission. Despite the ongoing challenges with the pandemic, we are proud to say that Open Door Mission's doors remained open and welcoming to those who needed help. We provided over 70,000 meals, 13,000 nights of shelter and collected nearly 300,000 pounds of clothing in 2021.

We celebrated a major milestone in 2021! In October, we broke ground on the renovation of our Miller Building on West Main Street. We are transforming this building from an outdated storage facility into 24 permanent supportive apartments. Our progress on this project is detailed in this annual report on page 7. We anticipate that this exciting new renovation will be complete and fully occupied by the end of 2022. This project will allow us to serve even more of Rochester's chronically homeless by offering a stable and secure place to call home.

Our women's and men's programs continue to flourish! Our Coldwater Women and Children's Home and men's addiction recovery program operated at near capacity throughout 2021. We hosted and helped a total of 31 men's recovery students and 37 families at our Coldwater home. Looking ahead we are hopeful to expand both these programs, so that we can assist even more families in the future.

Addiction Recovery




Students often participate in group activities and day trips. In this photo, students and ODM staff enjoy a meal out.

2021 Program Statistics



In 2021, Open Door Mission's recovery program served a total of 31 students. Our residential program is located at our Caring Center on Plymouth Avenue in the City of Rochester. We are a 90-Day transitional housing program for men experiencing struggles with chemical dependency, mental health or economic hardship. The program includes: case management; counseling; vocation and financial development; and overall recovery.

Due to referrals from our community partners, such as Helio Health, John L. Norris Addiction Treatment Center, Open Access/ Delphi Rise, Mental Health Association of Rochester, our program remained full throughout 2021.

Women and Children

Coldwater thrives with the support of the community. Many organizations and groups, like Calvary Assembly, are always lending a helping hand.

Coldwater Women and Children's Home continued to thrive in 2021 and was instrumental in getting moms and their children back on their feet. In 2021, we housed 37 families. 9 of which carried over from 2020. This included a total of 39 children. Since opening, 106 families have stayed at Coldwater.

On average, women and their children stayed approximately 3 months in our program. Throughout the year, moms attended classes on behavioral health, addiction recovery, resume building, job readiness, poetry, and Bible study. When a family was ready to move from Coldwater, Open Door Mission provided assistance for sustained success including: furniture; household goods; security deposits; and other person centered services.

In 2021, we began a birthday program for the children at Coldwater. Kind individuals donated decorations, cakes and presents for kids who were celebrating their birthday during their stay.



In 2021, 7 of our moms were classified as "parenting" youth" which means they were under the age of 25.





Food & Clothing Program

For nearly 70 years, Open Door Mission has provided emergency food to individuals in need. Meals are prepared daily at our Caring Center and distributed to each of our facilities. In 2021, our kitchen prepared 70,432 meals. In addition to providing warm meals, Open Door Mission also stocked several food pantries in the Rochester community. Specifically, we distributed 315,383 pounds of food to several pantries including: Glad Tidings; Fragrance of Christ; Grace Nazarene; Life Solutions; Out of the Darkness; and Shepherd's Heart Christian Fellowship.

In 2021, Open Door Mission also continued to distribute clothes to people in need. We continued to operate our clothing room, located at 156 North Plymouth Avenue, throughout the pandemic often providing families with curbside service. In total, Open Door Mission collected 289,486 pounds of clothes in 2021.

Volunteer groups returned in 2021! From August 30, 2020 to July 31, 2021, Open Door Mission hosted 930 volunteers. The number of volunteers decreased due to limits caused by the COVID pandemic. We are hopeful to have more groups and individuals return in 2022.

Emergency Shelter

From Jan 1, 2021 to Dec 31, 2021, our Samaritan House Crisis Center, located at 210 West Main Street, provided a total 13,228 beds for overnight stay. From November to April, Samaritan House also served as one of two warming centers in the City of Rochester. As a warming center, the Samaritan House kept its doors open 24 hours a day to help those suffering from the frigid temperatures.

Samaritan House can sleep up to 68 guests each night and often was at capacity in 2021. In addition to overnight accommodations, our guests had access to warm meals, essential laundry services and personalized case management assistance.

Our team continued to protect our guests throughout 2021 from the COVID pandemic by providing increased safety protocols including: mandatory masking and distancing; routine testing; increased sanitation measures; and isolation for symptomatic and positive guests.

Open Door Mission's fiscal year runs from July 1st to June 30th. In the fiscal year ending on June 30th, 2021, we had a total operating budget of \$5,365,002. In 2021, Open Door Mission had many sources of support including church giving, special events, foundations and government grants; however, our strongest source of support continued to be faithful, individual donors.

Despite the ongoing pandemic, Open Door Mission hosted three successful fundraisers in 2021 – virtual trivia, a "re-imagined" golf tournament and an in-person breakfast.

Our Executive Team and Managers have been able to periodically tour and assess the construction in progress.

In 2021, Open Door Mission embarked on a new endeavor – affordable housing. In October, our team broke ground on renovations to our Miller Building which will transform this property from a storage facility into 24 permanent supportive apartments. The property will offer 13 studio apartments and 11 one bedroom apartments. This project was made possible by a \$6 million grant from New York State's Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP).

The apartments, located at 230 West Main Street in the City of Rochester, will offer affordable housing to individuals who have been enduring chronic homelessness. Open Door Mission will provide on-site support services for residents including: case management; financial skills training; job readiness preparation; and job search assistance.

Open Door Mission has partnered with Hamilton Stern Construction, Passero Associates and MM Development Advisors on this project. It is anticipated to be completed and occupied by the end of 2022.

The Miller Building, owned by Open Door Mission, was formerly known as a department store named Archie's.
