God Answers a Mother's Prayers at Coldwater House



Shenel will never forget Mother's Day in 2016. That was the day her beloved mother suffered a stroke and passed away just a week later.

Shenel, separated from her husband and trying to raise four children on her own, had lost the one constant in her life. Overwhelmed by grief, she fell back on her coping mechanism: to shut down and go on autopilot.

"I was struggling," Shenel admits. "I was trying to work, but I didn't have enough money to keep things going, and I was really behind with the rent."

Eventually, she lost her apartment. Shenel was sleeping in her car with her children when she connected with a childhood friend who told her about Open Door Mission and Coldwater House.

Coming to Coldwater House was a relief for the single mother. "There was a peace I felt the whole time I was there. I got a chance to heal." Recalling the many times she had seen her mother praying in the year before her death, Shenel says, "Prayer is like a hand that goes out to the future. This was her prayer."

Today, Shenel has an apartment and a full-time job as a motor coach driver. Most importantly,

her family is together and doing well. "At Open Door Mission, this all became possible," she says. "Coldwater House is a connection God put into my life so I could move forward."

And Shenel has hopes to move even further forward — first as a homeowner, then as the author of a graphic novel and eventually, as a pilot! She still comes back to Coldwater House, often donating the great bargains she finds on clearance at Macy's.

"I am not rich with money, but I am so wealthy because of the people God has placed in my life at Coldwater," Shenel says. That includes you. "Everything you give is truly working because God is here."

With her children safe, Shenel was able to concentrate on getting her life in order, financially, emotionally and spiritually. "I couldn't believe the support. It was amazing."

Join us as we welcome Dr. Ben Carson to recognize Open Door Mission's 70th anniversary and honor those who have impacted the lives of our homeless neighbors.

Dr. Carson, former Presidential candidate and 17th Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, was born in Detroit to a single mother with a 3rd grade education who worked multiple jobs to support their family. Raised to love reading and education, he graduated from Yale University and earned his M.D. from the University of Michigan Medical School. For nearly 30 years, Secretary Carson served as Director of Pediatric Neurosurgery at the Johns Hopkins Children's Center, a position he assumed when he was just 33 years old, becoming the youngest

major division director in the hospital's history.

Dr. Carson received dozens of honors and awards, including the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor. He is also a recipient of the Spingarn Medal, the highest honor bestowed by the National



Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and has been awarded over 70 honorary doctorate degrees. Dr. Carson has authored nine books.
