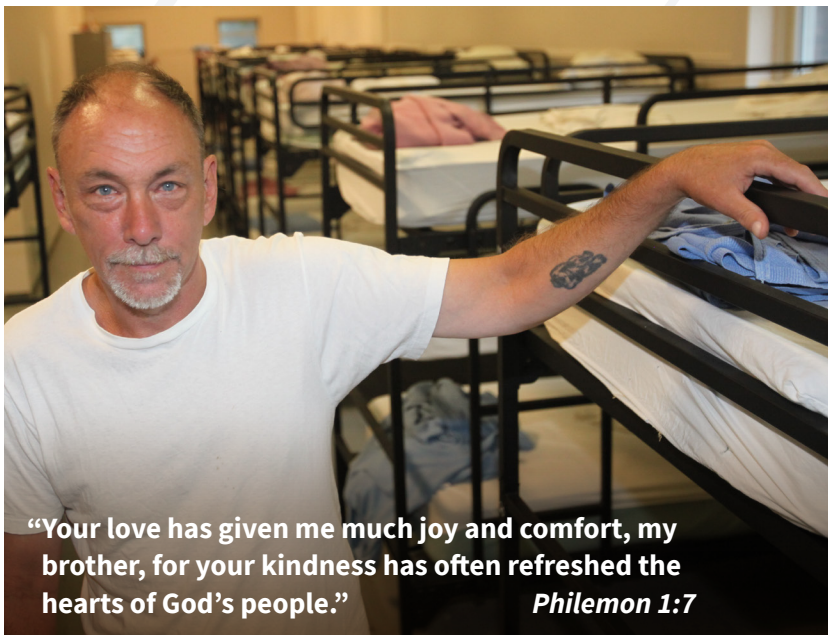

Dear Friends:

2020 was like no other year we have ever seen. The COVID pandemic took a physical, emotional and financial toll on our community but together, with your help, the Open Door Mission came out stronger than ever. In 2020, we served more meals than ever, housed more guests than ever and helped more families than ever before. In the face of so much uncertainty, Open Door Mission was supported by the faith of our supporters and the love of our community.

2020 was an uphill battle for not for profits across the country, particularly in New York State. We are so proud to say that our staff at Open Door Mission rose to the challenge. We quickly adjusted our protocols and procedures, so that we were able to continue services to those who needed them most. In March, we began implementing procedures quickly – we provided PPE for our staff, implemented social distancing measures and changed our communal meal service to a grab and go style. As the pandemic progressed, we administered testing clinics twice a week for guests and staff and safely isolated those who became infected with COVID 19.

COVID caused us to restructure some of our services while expanding others. In March, we decided to restructure our clothing program. While we continue

to accept clothing donations and distribute clothing to those in need, we closed our storefront boutique which we had been offering for several years. We also partnered with Monroe County to move some guests to the Raddison and Rodeway hotels in an effort to keep our numbers low in our shelters and provide for distancing. We continue to serve up to 30 additional guests daily at the Rodeway Inn. When the pandemic began, we braced for a hard financial hit but ended up being overwhelmed by the generosity of our donors who gave and supported us like never before. It is because of your kindness that we were able to keep our doors open.

We could not do any of the work we are doing without you – your financial support, your prayers, and your generous donations of food and clothing keep us going and allow us to serve our homeless guests and families. Thank you for your unprecedented support in 2020 and please continue your prayers of protection over the Open Door Mission through 2021! May God bless you in the coming year.

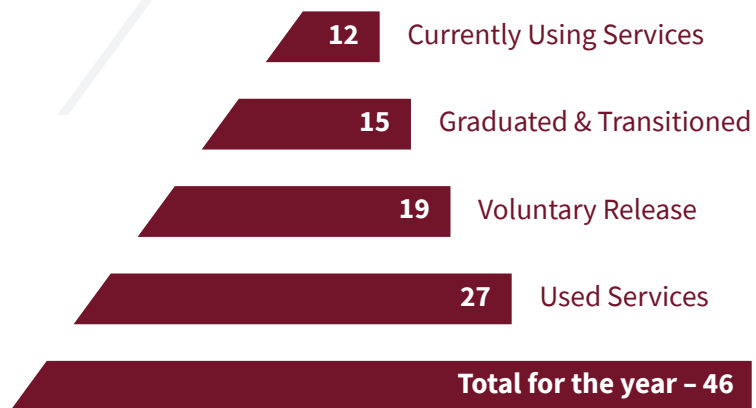
Addiction Recovery

In 2020, Open Door Mission’s addiction recovery program served a total of 46 addiction recovery students. Our successful phased recovery program supports individuals suffering from addiction who are trying to turn their lives around. We offer an array of services, including: a 60-day stability program (residential or non-residential); discipleship; comprehensive case management; 8-12 month residential program; counseling; life skills; transitional living program; and transportation facilitation for medical services. Our dormitory, located at our Caring Center on Plymouth Avenue in the City of Rochester, has maximum space for up to 20 students.

92% of graduates, who stay for graduate after care services, secure successful employment.

Introducing the Women’s Day Treatment Program

In 2020, Open Door Mission launched its Women’s Day Treatment Program. This is one of Rochester’s only addiction recovery programs exclusively for women. The new Women’s Day Treatment Program entails a 60 day curriculum that meets daily from 9am to 12:30pm Monday to Friday.

Emergency Shelter

The Samaritan House Crisis Center, located at 210 Main Street, provides shelter to those in need. In addition to overnight accommodations, we give our guests access to warm meals, essential laundry services and personalized case management assistance for those seeking permanent housing and other person centered services.

From Jan 1, 2020 to Dec 31, 2020, the shelter served a total of 14,517 beds for overnight stay. That's an average of approximately 39 guests per night. From November to March, Samaritan House Crisis Center also served as one of two warming centers in the City of Rochester. As a warming center, the Samaritan House kept its doors open 24 hours a day to help those suffering from the frigid temperatures.



In 2020 Safety of Our Guests was our Number One Priority

The COVID pandemic made 2020 a challenging year for everyone, especially the homeless.

At Open Door Mission, our staff went the extra mile to make sure our guests were safe and we were able to keep our doors open every day throughout 2020! Safety protocols put in place include:

- Personal Protective Equipment for staff;
- Mandatory mask guidelines for guests;
- Routine testing of guests and staff;
- Increased sanitation and cleaning procedures;
- Changed group dining to individually boxed meals;
- Distancing of guests;
- Isolation area for guests who are feeling sick.

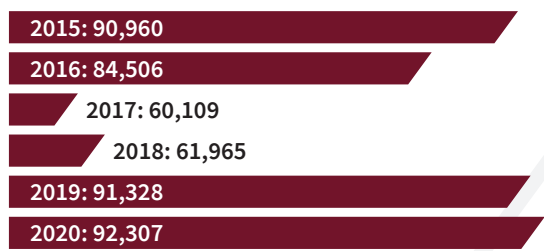
Open 24/7

In partnership with Monroe County in an effort to limit the number of homeless guests at shelters, Open Door Mission served up to an additional 50 guests a night at the Rodeway Inn during 2020.

Food/Clothing Program

At the center of what we do at Open Door Mission is to provide food and meals to those in need. ODM has offered a food program to the community since its inception in 1952. In 2020, we served more meals than ever before – 92,307.

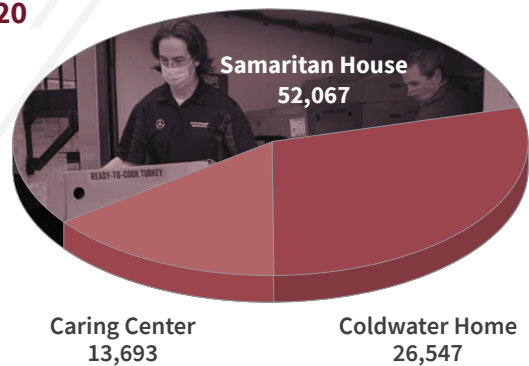
Meals Served Annually



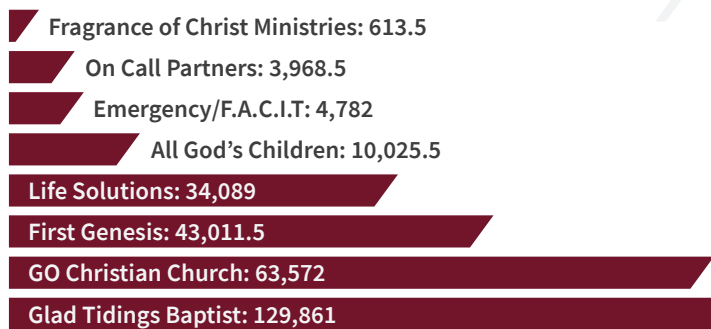
In addition to serving meals to those in need, we distributed a total of 289,923 pounds of food to local pantries in 2020. Due to COVID, we estimated that there was a 200 percent increase in the request for food support and delivery to individuals and families in 2020. These requests were driven by high unemployment due to layoffs, lack of access to childcare and the lack of access to some pantries who traditionally are staffed by volunteers but could not operate during the pandemic.

In 2020, Open Door Mission collected a total of 310,000 pounds of donated clothes from the community.

Women and Children

Coldwater Women and Children’s Home has been filled to capacity since we opened our doors in 2018. There are many different reasons that moms have come to our Coldwater shelter. Sometimes they have been left homeless due to job loss, sometimes they are escaping a dangerous or abusive situation. Whatever the reason, we offer them a safe place to stay to rebuild their lives and strengthen their families. Since the inception of the program, 69 families have stayed at Coldwater with a total of 111 children.



Volunteers at Coldwater have filled many roles – they have taught classes on various life skills, offered tutoring services or worked as guest chefs.

Open Door Mission helps provide whatever support she may need for sustained success including: furniture; household goods; rental assistance; and other person centered services.



In 2020, 40 families stayed in Coldwater – a total of 33 new moms with 7 moms carried over from 2019.

While every situation is different, on average, women and their children stay approximately 3 months in our program. Each week, moms are provided with different courses by the case manager and interns such as budgeting, self care, coping skills, and mental health awareness classes. Our dedicated team assist moms with job searching and career readiness skills. When a mom is ready to move from Coldwater,

In 2020, tutoring services were provided to all school aged children who lived at Coldwater. Often children attended school remotely from our Coldwater shelter.

Responsible Stewardship

Open Door Mission has relied on the generosity of its donors to keep its doors open. Since opening in the 1950s, we estimate that approximately 98 percent of our operations have been funded by private sources including individual donors, community organizations and local businesses. We are proud of our legacy of fiscal responsibility and are thankful to our dedicated, faithful donors. Our fiscal year runs from July 1st to June 30th, with an operating budget for 2019-2020 of approximately \$4.8 million.

What's Happening Next

Exciting new chapter beginning in 2021

On February 3, 2021, Open Door Mission was notified that we will be receiving \$6,084,520 in Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP) funds to build 24 permanent supportive apartments in the City of Rochester. HHAP provides capital grants and loans to not-for-profit corporations, charitable and religious organizations, municipalities and public corporations to acquire, construct or rehabilitate housing for the homeless.

The proposed apartments will be located at 226-234 West Main Street in the City of Rochester in an existing, vacant property known as the Miller Building. The Miller Building is currently owned by the Open Door Mission and is neighboring to our Samaritan House emergency shelter.



The Miller Building, remembered by some as Archie's department store, will undergo a substantial rehabilitation to become 24 permanent supportive apartments. The property will offer 13 studio apartments and 11 one bedroom apartments. Open Door Mission will provide on-site support services for residents including: case management, job readiness training, financial management skill training, and job search assistance. The project has a 12 month construction period and is expected to be ready for occupancy by Spring of 2022.
