Please join us for a morning of hope as we listen to the testimony of those we have served and honor heroes who have made our work possible.

We are excited to have Dr. Ben Carson as our featured speaker.

For nearly 30 years, Dr. Carson served as Director of Pediatric Neurosurgery at the Johns Hopkins Children's Center, a position he assumed when he was just 33 years old, becoming the youngest major division director in the hospital's history. In 1987, he successfully performed the first separation of craniopagus twins conjoined at the back of the head. He most recently served as the 17th Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. During his tenure as HUD Secretary, he had an unprecedented record of helping faith based organizations, like Open Door Mission.

You Gave Tangie and her Son

a Peaceful Place

"Coldwater House felt like home."

Tangie never forgot how good it felt to have a place of her own. When she lost her house to a foreclosure, she also lost her sense of stability and direction. Along with her teenage son, she stayed with various friends and family members, "hopping from house to house."

Finally, settling in with a friend, Tangie thought her days of drifting were over. But after an argument, she and her son were on the street ... and they had worn out all their welcomes. They went to a local shelter but maxed out their stay at three months. Then Tangie heard about Open Door Mission and Coldwater House.

"Open Door helped us so much. Everyone was so supportive," Tangie tells us. "There were house meetings and I'd meet with my case manager. I had people who listened to what was going on with me. The other women staying there were good listeners. They'd been through what I was going through."

Even more important, she says, "After being in the shelter, Coldwater House felt like home. We got to meet the other women and their children. It was like a family there. We felt at peace."

Tangie and her son appreciated being able to live according to their work and school schedules, relax in a family-oriented setting in the evenings and even cook their own meals. Being in a Christian environment and attending Bible studies was another big plus for Tangie. "I am a true believer in God, so

Just a few months after coming to Coldwater House, Tangie and her son moved into their own apartment. Their "house-hopping" days behind them, they are enjoying their new lives. Tangie is currently a bus monitor, studying for her CDL to become a driver. Looking further ahead, she hopes to return to college and complete her degree in child psychology. "I'd like to be a counselor or something of that nature," she says.

Tangie knows she wouldn't have hope for the future — or a home — without your support for Open Door Mission. "God has put it on your heart to give, and I'm grateful. He put Open Door here to bless us."
