Dear friends,

Throughout May and June, we are praying for the women and ministry of TWR Women of Hope across Asia. This vast region of the world includes women facing inequality and poverty, as well as women who are educated and in life circumstances similar to us in Canada.

In Korea, the TWR Women of Hope ministry focuses on prayer for the ministry, much like here in Canada. One faithful praver warrior recently shared: "I cannot attend the TWR Women of Hope prayer gathering regularly because of work, but whenever time allows. I try to participate. When I join and pray with others, I feel more energized and gracious than when I prav alone. I distribute the prayer calendars to colleagues, who read it and say they can't believe there are still so many women around the world who are living such a hard life."

Perhaps your experience is similar to that of this woman's colleagues. As you read and pray through the requests in these bimonthly calendars, perhaps you are surprised by the situations that women around the world experience, and perhaps even discouraged. But take heart! God is at work.

First John 5:14-15 reminds us "And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him." Our God hears us when we pray, and he acts. His Word tells us this, and we can hold fast to this truth.

As you read and pray through the requests over the next two months, may you not only see the hard situations in which women across Asia find themselves, but would you also see the hope they have and the ways in which they place their trust in God. May we join with these women, lifting up their requests to God, knowing that he hears our prayers and will answer us.

From the Hearts of Those Across the Region

From a listener in Nepal: "Every time I feel weak, this program has helped and encouraged me. I was treated unfairly, as I come from a low-caste family, but thanks to the Women of Hope radio program, I learned that God truly does love me. Through the Word of God, the hosts convey the good news to the listeners of this program. It was helpful to me, and I think that programs like this can be helpful to many other people as well. So, whenever I have the opportunity, I share about Jesus with others."

From a listener in Japan: "My family and I listen to the program together over lunch. The atmosphere was very calm and peaceful, and I wanted to listen to it all the time. While listening to the thoughts and anxieties of ordinary people, the gospel of the Word was clearly spoken, and in some places I almost cried out in response."

From a listener in Sri Lanka: "I am a believer. I've been listening to this program for over three years, and I've learned a lot. This program assists us in learning not only about the Bible but also about many other topics in society. As a woman, I have faced many challenges in my life, and this program has given me tremendous strength during those times. That is something I thank God for. And I appreciate the program's efforts to change a corrupt society."

From a listener in Pakistan: "I listen to the Women of Hope Punjabi radio program on a regular basis. I am illiterate and want to gain social, religious and cultural knowledge, and these programs are aiding me greatly in that endeavour. I like the presenter, and it is my request that these programs be broadcast live so that we can discuss our concerns and learn more about the topics."



Praying for Revival in Japan

After I received a year of training in South Korea, the TWR Women of Hope ministry in Japan was launched in March 2022. We began with a prayer ministry, published a prayer calendar each month and uploaded those prayer requests each day onto social media. Recently, we have redesigned the calendar into a beautiful colour version, organized the prayer requests by country and included information from each country along with a regional map.

Transcending national and ethnic boundaries, sisters come together as one in the Lord for our TWR Women of Hope monthly prayer meetings. As we pray, we are on fire with the Holy Spirit and with God's love for each other and the world. The women are encouraged and feel the genuine power of our prayers. As we pray for each other and share our personal testimonies and requests, we connect and grow alongside one another.

One time we prayed for the health of a friend. Months later, the

friend became well and began helping our ministry and joined our prayer meeting. Praise the Lord! God indeed listens to every prayer. We are to be "praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints," the Apostle Paul reminds us in Ephesians 6:18. Prayer is our main work, and we pray unceasingly for women in the world who need our God and for God to expand this circle of prayer.

In October 2022, the Women of Hope program began airing on 11 community FM stations throughout Japan as well as via YouTube. To commemorate this milestone, we held a worship service of thanksgiving in November with guests coming from South Korea. We had a blessed time of worship and fellowship with the hosts, program teams, volunteers and supporters.

TWR Women of Hope Japan has received many responses to the



program, the listeners saying they look forward to listening to it every week. Another shared, "It is easy to understand. The content is excellent for evangelism and for personal sharing." And another observed, "I liked the theme about fear. I enjoy listening to different themes from women's perspectives."

The translation, production and prayer teams, along with the program hosts, are active in prayer, in their local churches and in personal evangelism. Our volunteers tell us that their faith is deepening and that their prayers are being answered. As we seek to do God's will, we work hard to expand the ministry and wish to further publicize the Women of Hope program.

If you were to converse with typical mothers in India, you would often hear how overworked and underappreciated they feel. That no one understands or cares for their needs is a common sentiment resonating among mothers on social media.

Desiring to bring hope and comfort, the *Women of Hope* television program in Tamil discusses the issues that mothers currently face. And their responses coming from these discussions have been truly encouraging.

Prabavathy's^{*} life was transformed as she watched our program that featured a family with a child who was disabled. The story spoke of a mother who understood her child's struggles and worked to nurture him in the areas that he was able to

develop in. The child, perceiving her love, reciprocated and attempted to respond to her attempts to help him.

Prabavathy, who is herself the mother of a disabled child, was touched by the way the story realistically portrayed the mother's exhaustion and depression from not knowing how to care for her child. The program encouraged her to not give up hope and to seek God's help in identifying the right methods for connecting with and nurturing her child. She spoke with our audience relations team and thanked them for being God's answer for her struggling family.

Saridha^{*}, too, found hope in God through our program that spoke of a woman who was unable to bear a child. Saridha was frustrated and aggressive toward her colleagues as most of their conversations centered around their children. She was losing hope, and her emotions were spilling out in unhealthy ways.

But her conversations with our audience relations team became the outlet she needed for her pain. As they counselled and prayed with her, Saridha found joy and a renewed sense of hope for her future.

Women in India have little access to godly help in everyday struggles. Please pray that the TWR Women of Hope ministry will continue to be their avenue to spiritually enriched, meaningful lives.

A Message from TWR Women of Hope Global Director Susie Pek



Dear friends,

As I embark on this beautiful journey of caring for TWR Women of Hope and leading it into the future, I look back and ponder all the ways the Lord has led me. I wonder if you like to do the same when faced with changes. As we examine our pasts, we learn about ourselves, consider the changes in our lives and have the wonderful opportunity to make new choices. The best part is we get to be reminded of the Lord's goodness and faithfulness.

Just days before I started this new season, a situation took me back to when I first came to know the Lord. The short version of the story is that I was raised by a Christian mom and a non-Christian father. My dad never opposed church or Christian living but was very resistant to giving his life to Jesus. I didn't realize, however, that I was too.

I attended church and tried following some "rules." I knew in my head that the Bible was true and that Jesus was the Saviour of the world, but I had never really given my life to him. I heard people say Jesus had changed their lives completely, but I'll be honest: the thought of being transformed bothered me. I thought I was cool and did not want to run the risk of turning into a dull person.

My "coolness" successfully hid a lot of hurt and pain from the eyes of the people around me. My life was surrounded by people, but my heart was still lacking in love. How could someone possibly love me? I tried dealing with all that in my own strength. I thought that suppressing the memories of the abuses and feelings of rejection would be enough. It wasn't.

Also, I did not realize it, but I searched for unconditional love in all my relationships. I longed to be loved, accepted, appreciated and cared for, so I strived to be the best version of myself (within my understanding) to my family, friends, colleagues and boyfriends in the hope that I would earn their love.

In my first year of college, I was faced with a situation, and I knew that my response to it would be a turning point in my life. The choice I made would lead me to either a wonderful road or a terrible one. Deep within me, I knew Christ was the answer. So, I finally surrendered and gave my life to Christ. From day one, an intense transformation process started. The chaos in my inner world did not go away overnight; it took time. God's love had reached me, but I still could not fully "receive it."

Over the years, the Lord gently ministered his love for me through my quiet times, circumstances and people. It has been a journey of constantly receiving his love, knowing that he is the only one who is able to fill the voids in our hearts. He loves me in a way that nobody else does. He loves you in that same way. And his love enables us to receive love from others and to offer them love.

Although it took me a while to dive deeper into God's love, from the beginning of my relationship with him, that love changed the way I saw the world. I heard many testimonies about the impact of prayer and wanted to have my own experiences. I wanted to touch the world through prayer. That same year, I could not hold back the tears when I heard the news of a major development in a political situation. I had prayed for such a change to occur!

That same love led me to pursue preparation to go into ministry years ago. Since then, I had the honour of serving in different ministries. I clearly remember when I first heard of Project Hannah, the original name of TWR Women of Hope. The words "compassion and prayer for women" touched my heart. I thought to myself: "One day I'll work with that project." I shared it with my husband and prayed about it. About five years later I joined the project. What an amazing journey it has been. I'm so thankful to be able to pray for women all over the world. To speak hope to their hearts. To point them to Jesus, our living hope.

My prayer and heart's desire are that women around the world and across generations will "know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God" (Eph. 3.19).

- 22. God we ask that fathers in Mongolia lead their families responsibly. Also, please help single mothers to overcome the difficulties of parenting without husbands. (Prov. 4:1-9)
- 23. Father, give the next generation of Christians in Korea the wisdom and skills needed to expand your kingdom. (Matt. 9:38)

- 24. Lord, provide physical and spiritual protection for Japanese single mothers, for women facing poverty and for families suffering from domestic violence. Be their refuge. (Ps. 34:7-9)

Prayer in His Name

A Word of Hope from Lisa Hall, International Prayer Coordinator



A person's name is important; it identifies who she is.

In honor of both of my grandmothers, Elsie and Elizabeth, my parents named me Lisa. I longed to know more of my namesakes and was told I had so many of their qualities. But the meaning of my name was even more important to me. It was displayed on a plaque in my room:

> Lisa – Consecrated One – "'The LORD is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore, I will hope in him.'" (Lam. 3:24)

Each day I was reminded that I was consecrated to God, set apart for him. And I desired to live out the meaning of my name.

In the Bible, God reveals himself to us through his names. They often tell us much about his character, describe his attributes and show how he desires to relate to us, his children. When we have an accurate view of God, it becomes the lens through which we view and live out our lives. When we learn and pray God's names, we proclaim them and their truth over our lives and world. We are reaching out in faith to God, showing that we trust that he will act and be what his name declares.

When God appeared to Moses in a burning bush and Moses asked his name, God replied, "IAM WHO IAM ... Say this to the people of Israel: 'I AM has sent me to vou'" (Exod. 3:14). The Hebrew meaning does show selfexistence, but it is more. It connotes that God is ever-present with his people, focusing his attention, power and grace on them. For the first time, God has shared with the Israelites his personal name, "I AM," which was written as YHWH in Hebrew. This is often translated as Yahweh or Jehovah, and Bibles often represent this name with capital letters: LORD.

We too can call on the name of Yahweh, the ever-present God who is near his people. Many times in Scripture, characteristics of God are combined with his personal name. We can pray to:

Yahweh Yireh – **The LORD Will Provide** (Gen. 22:14). What needs are you trusting God to provide as you live for him?

Yahweh Tsevaoth – **The LORD** of Hosts (1 Sam. 17:45). David defeated Goliath in this name.

What giants are you facing in your life? Ask the LORD of angel armies to fight on your behalf.

Yahweh Rophe – **The LORD Our Healer** (Exod. 15:25-26, Ps. 6:2-3). Through Jesus, God desires to bring us physical, moral and spiritual healing. Trust him and pray to him for your holistic healing of mind, body and soul.

Consider how you can pray these names of God: Yahweh Osenu – The LORD Our Maker (Ps. 95:6); Yahweh Nissi – The LORD Our Banner – (Exod. 17:15); Yahweh Tsuri – The LORD My Rock (Deut. 32:4); Yahweh Shalom – The LORD Our Peace (Judg. 6:24), Yahweh Tsidqenu – The LORD Our Righteousness (Jer. 33:16); El Roi – **The God Who Sees Me** (Gen. 16:13); El Shaddai – **God Almighty** (Gen. 17:1); El Emunah – **Faithful God** (Deut. 32:4).

My favorite passage is when God describes himself:

"The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty" (Exod. 34:6-7).

Be strengthened in your faith and grow in your intimacy with God as you pray to him using his many beautiful names!
