ST. JOHN'S ICARE FOUNDATION PURCHASES \$20,000 IN EQUIPMENT FOR THE NEW CLINICAL LEARNING CENTER

The officers of the St. John's ICARE Foundation approved \$20,000 from this year's Golf Tournament proceeds to purchase equipment for the new Clinical Learning Center (CLC). The equipment purchases include:

• Ultrasound - A fully functional ultrasound system with a probe and stand to train learners on ultrasound skills, line placement, and various ultrasound uses in clinical and procedural settings.

• PICC Line Man - A sonogram-viable, fully vascular line placement trainer sufficient for teaching Midline and PICC line skills.

• Lumbar Puncture Trainer - A lower torso trainer for use in a variety of lumbar puncture-related skills for various learners.

• Headwalls - Oxygen and Suction headwalls for use in trauma and OR sim rooms to increase realism/fidelity and allow for the incorporation of additional skills.

• **Crash Cart** - A full-sized crash cart complete with code scenario supplies to allow for a greater range of sim scenarios.

• Suzie Simon - A full-body training Manikin for use by various learners to improve patient skills.

"We thank the donors of the St. John's ICARE Foundation for this generous and thoughtful contribution of \$20,000 towards desperately needed simulation equipment. This will greatly benefit the CLC here at St. John's Episcopal Hospital," said Eric W. Stern, MS, CHSE, Director of Simulation. University School of Medicine, held a ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 14 to mark the completion of a new CLC. The CLC, located at 19-09 Plainview Avenue on the St. John's Episcopal Hospital Campus, will provide an innovative learning environment, including the latest teaching technologies and much-needed meeting space for medical students who train at the hospital.

The CLC features state-of-the-art simulation labs to support medical training. Each sim lab is equipped with standard furniture and equipment found within a hospital facility, from computer technology to diagnostic tools. There are sophisticated mannequins controlled by an operator to emulate situations our medical students will face in the real world. There is also a skills lab where students can learn the basics and hone their skills along with a Scrub Sim area to teach good practices for the OR.

In addition to being a teaching facility, the CLC will be home to the St. John's Ambulatory Clinic, currently located on the 5th floor of St. John's Episcopal Hospital, a Medical Library, and the organization's Information Technology Department.

"This building is extremely important to EHS," said the CEO of Episcopal Health Services, Jerry Walsh. "We are a growing organization and expanding not only in terms of care but by educating tomorrow's medical leaders. When looking at our strategic priorities, we look at how we can enhance the experience of patients, our students, and our team members. This building reflects this priority!"

FROM THE KITCHEN TO THE HEART – ANDREA'S JOURNEY OF COOKING, CARING AND COURAGE THROUGH BREAST CANCER

"I have a lot of feeding left to do," says Andrea, 41, a mother of four and a private caterer who honed her culinary skills in her grandmother's kitchen, drawing inspiration from her rich Guyanese heritage—flavors of the Caribbean, infused with a unique food style all her own. But in October 2022, a sudden discovery changed the course of her life.

"I felt a lymph node in my armpit," she explains. "One day, a big lump suddenly appeared."

Andrea immediately made an appointment with her primary care physician, who referred her for a sonogram and mammogram. The results prompted a biopsy, followed by the shocking news of a breast cancer diagnosis, a disease that Andrea says runs in her father's side of the family.

Scared of the unknown, Andrea sought treatment with New York Cancer & Blood Specialists at St. John's Episcopal Hospital and met oncologist Dr. Joshua Harris.

"Dr. Harris explained the entire process, outlining every step he intended to take," she recalls. "I realized he knew what he was doing, and I had the confidence that he was the doctor who would be there to guide me through this journey."

Andrea underwent 17 rounds of chemotherapy, experiencing symptoms such as nausea, fatigue, and hair loss. She says, "I felt like a boss when I cut my hair."

In September 2023, Andrea underwent a double mastectomy and is currently on the road to healing. With 30 days of preventive radiation treatment on the horizon, she anticipates her return to the company she holds dear once she has made a full recovery.

Throughout it all, Andrea always remained optimistic. Even when she was terminated from her employer of eight years and no longer had a source of income. "Every time I looked at my children, I'd think, there's no time to give up."

Thanks to Andrea's wonderful husband of 18 years and amazing support system, surrendering was never an option. "Dr. Harris and his team are great. All of the nurses, Nina, Roman, and Ray," she relayed.

"Throughout Andrea's entire treatment, she always came in with a smile and rarely complained," said her nurse Nina. "We are so happy to see Andrea restored to the happy, positive, beautiful person that she is. We are so proud of her and all our patients who are so strong and persevere."

The St. John's ICARE Foundation also extended a helping hand in providing valuable resources for her children, such as school supplies and gift cards.

"Cancer changes you. It pushed me in the right direction for a lot of things," said Andrea. Now, she looks forward to her new normal when she can go on a weekend getaway with her husband and get back to doing what she enjoys most. "I absolutely love cooking. I was born to do that."

R - Respect FROM PACKING UP TO GIVING AWAY – FIRST DISTRIBUTION OF SELF-CARE BAGS BENEFITS 200 TEENS

In late September, the St. John's ICARE Foundation, team members, volunteers from National Grid, and the St. John's Hospital Auxiliary began assembling 200 of the 1,000 selfcare bags to be distributed to teenagers in the Rockaways. The ICARE Teen's Hygiene Project was funded by the Amazin' Mets Foundation, which consists of a reusable duffle bag filled with items such as a bath towel, shampoo, conditioner, soap, toothbrush, and toothpaste for each teen. In addition, each bag has a luggage tag with a QR code linking to vital information about depression, bullying, addiction, nutrition, and more. The first bag giveaway was held outside St. John's Episcopal Hospital in October. Episcopal Health Services Population Health and the Behavioral Health Departments were also on hand with important information for our teens. Our next distribution will be in January.
