Deciding what I want to do after high school has been influenced by my childhood and my story is only the beginning of what I hope to do. The Dowling Educational Scholarship would help me on this journey which started many years ago in preschool. "Sophia, tú no necesitas ir a una terapista, eso solo es un gasto de dinero, no eres loca para estar yendo para allá" is what my dad would say because in our culture going to therapy is almost as frowned upon as a sin. My mom and I would go secretly because he never understood the reason that I was going was because of him. I was in preschool the first time I went and from then on I was one of the kids who had to eat lunch with the school psychologist at least once a week to make sure I was okay. I thought it was normal to have to talk to someone about my feelings, but I remember that one day my dad called and my mom told me to lie so he wouldn't know that I was waiting to see my therapist. I was lucky that at least one of my parents understood the necessity of taking care of your mental health, but many kids in my community are a lot less fortunate.

For example, in the capital of Honduras, Tegucigalpa, there are only 56 mental health specialists for 9.5 million citizens, so nobody in our family even considered looking for help. There were not enough options. My older brother Sammer came to this country when he was 12. He was struggling and it only got worse when he arrived and attempted to adjust. He thought the only solution was drugs. My family went through a lot trying to understand him and find ways to help him; my mom knew that therapy was helping me so that could possibly help him. Once he started helping himself and talking about those grudges he held onto so firmly, he was able to grow and improve.

Now over a decade later, I still see my peers and my Hispanic community struggle to find a way to cope with life's hardships. People like my brother and I shouldn't be shamed by our family and community for having these feelings. Trying to break that barrier is something I still deal with everyday. Many of the Hispanic boys I talk to think that crying or talking about their emotions makes them less of a man and the first generation Hispanic girls think they can't show their emotions because they have to live up to their parents' expectations. These strong emotions can push someone over the edge and even though that may seem like an extreme, it is the reality. I am a firm believer that mental health should always be the number one priority in a person's life.

All of this has motivated me in school, as well. I am the president of my school's Youth to Youth club where we bring awareness to substance abuse and its correlation to mental health. My main interest for the next four years of my life is to major in psychology to help my Hispanic community by bringing awareness to the importance of mental health. I know that breaking these ancient ideologies can be very challenging, but I know that with enough perseverance and determination, I am hopeful that I can achieve my goal. I'm not exactly sure what I want to do with my life but I know my ultimate goal is to better my Hispanic community and I know that bringing awareness to the importance of mental health can save lives like it did for me and my

brothers. I hope The Dowling Educational Scholarship can help me achieve this goal of overcoming the stigma by helping me afford a higher education.

Letter of Sophia Alvarez D.O.B. 12/15/2006 Bright, energetic, resilient. ACADEMICS

Sophia has been part of our AVID program since middle school. Advancement Via Individual Determination is a nation-wide program for first generation, economically disadvantaged students with demonstrated academic and college potential. Sophia has been a leader in her cohort since day one. She asks thought-provoking questions and advocates for what she believes is right. She is also a patient and active listener. When she comes against someone with opposing views, she hears them out and considers what they have to share. She is flexible, always willing to entertain different ideas and perspectives.

Although Sophia thrives in AVID, her high school experience has been like a roller coaster. She has tremendous highs and then lows. She admits that this has been due to mixed priorities and personal issues and takes full responsibilities for her grades. However, she is one of the few students in my thirty plus career as a counselor whose transcript is not representative of ability or academic potential. This year she is enrolled in our honors-level interdisciplinary humanities course, Society, Literature and Truth. SLT is a double block class that requires reading and digesting of dense literature at a brisk pace. Students must come to class ready to participate. Sophia not only has an A in the class but has already distinguished herself as a leader in group work and an outstanding facilitator of discussion. This is a just a glimpse of what she will bring to a college classroom.

EXTRACURRICULARS

Sophia has held part-time and summer jobs to help her mother with household expenses and to have money for herself throughout high school. Her passion and greatest commitment in high school, however, has been through Youth to Youth. Youth to Youth is a club that promotes physical and emotional wellness to youth while educating the community on the risks and dangers of substance use and abuse. This is something personal for Sophia, and she takes her leadership role in the organization seriously. Last year she served as vice president and this year is co-president. He co-leader is a close friend and excellent public speaker and promoter. Sophia, however, is the doer. She is the force behind the scenes that comes up with campaigns and workshops, organizes fundraising events and brings in professional speakers to address the student body. Sophia has excellent attention to detail and there is no task to big or small for her. She is the leader who executes ideas, she sees things through to completion and leads by example.

CHARACTER/FAMILY/UNIQUE CIRCUMSTANCES

Sophia is part of a single parent household. She lives with her mother who has worked long hours is an assortment of jobs since Sophia was a small girl. At first, Sophia was cared for and primarily raised by her older brothers. As she grew older, she was left at home alone a great deal, having to prepare meals and clean and essentially fend for herself. After her parents first separated, Sophia was required to visit her father on weekends. The physical violence in his household became so acute that Sophia refused to visit. She had no contact for more than two years. As you can imagine, this impacted Sophia tremendously at home and trickled into her performance at school. While her relationship with her father has improved, tensions between her brothers and dad have not. There have been recent instances of fist fights in front of Sophia and police intervention.

Sophia's mother, while still seldom home, remarried last summer. Her husband resides in South Carolina where she will eventually move after Sophia's graduation. Unfortunately, while this man does nothing to support Sophia, his income may impact her financial aid. Another worry and upheaval in Sophia's personal life.

I believe Sophia Alvarez has enormous personal and academic potential. She is interest in psychology and hopes to enter the field of criminal justice in a capacity where she will be able to make a positive impact in people's lives. I am confident that she can and will make a difference. I urge you to carefully consider her application for admission.
