751 families received housing stability services; referrals to permanent housing; support for legal, educational or employment needs; counseling and recovery referrals.

We accomplished so much and are so proud:

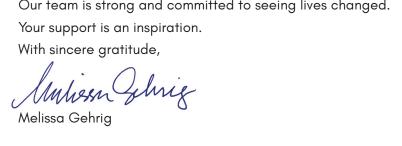
- Opened a 2nd Diversion Center in Burien a 3rd planned for Shoreline in 2023.

- Provided greater opportunities for staff professional, personal and spiritual growth.

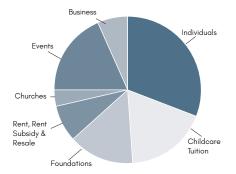

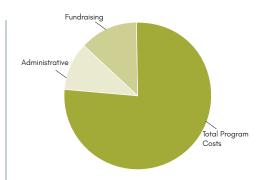

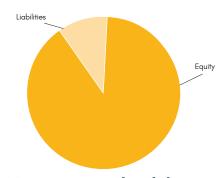
