# Outcomes You Made Possible

Family Services: Client-driven tailored services to end homelessness for one family at a time

- Housing and supportive services for 176
  homeless individuals: 111 children, 57 mothers
  and 8 fathers.
- 88% of Vision House families completed the program and transitioned to permanent housing.
- Families logged **193** hours of direct services in attachment to restore family bonds.
- Parents engaged in 715 hours of supportive and empowering case management.
- 31 of our alumni families received financial support.
- Parents achieved 104% increase in Life Skills Development.

Diversion: Approach that provides face to face conversation to prevent homelessness for families by identifying immediate safe and stable housing solutions

- 562 families received referral information to other housing options and social service providers.
- 210 families received financial support to secure housing.
- Financial support was provided in multiple forms such as gift cards and financial assistance for gas, bus tickets, food and clothing.
