Without a transitional house we have no place to accommodate sick clients. When we had the Dambly House sick clients were never a problem but not having this resource is the main reason IHOC has been unable to restart

the Hospitality Network. However, transitional housing also gave clients in the Hospitality Network the time needed to complete all the work needed to move from homelessness to permanent housing and a new transitional house will fill this need as well.

While I cannot provide final information about a new transitional house at the time. I believe I will be able to do so in January. So "stay tuned" and keep IHOC 's mission in your prayers.
