

NATIONAL SURVEY: The Assessment of Women Presenting to the Emergency Department with Chest Pain



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Women's cardiovascular (CV) care often begins in emergency departments (ED).

Knowing how to recognize women with CV disease and triage them to appropriate services is the cornerstone to improved CV outcomes.

The Canadian Women's Heart Health Alliance (CWHHA) is conducting a national survey of prehospital healthcare providers (Paramedics, ED physicians and medical staff, rural family physicians, cardiologists, internists, nurses and nurse practitioners) in order to:

- Assess baseline knowledge;
- Obtain their feedback on the Chest Pain (CP) Protocol for Women Presenting to the Emergency Department, and;
- Understand feasibility for protocol uptake at their site.

The results of this survey will inform triage decisions in women with chest pain.

This survey is anonymous and should take 10 minutes.

The deadline to complete the survey is **June 30, 2024.**
